

PREVIEW WOMEN INDIVIDUAL LARGE HILL TITISEE-NEUSTADT – Friday 9 Dec 2022

Silje Opseth

- Silje Opseth won one of the two individual World Cup events in both Wisla and Lillehammer this season. In 2021/22, Sara Marita Kramer recorded at least one individual World Cup win at each of the first four venues on the calendar.
- Opseth had only one individual World Cup win prior to this season, in Oslo in March 2022. The only other Norwegian female ski jumper on multiple individual World Cup wins is Maren Lundby (30).
- Opseth is age 23. Lundby had won 13 individual World Cup events before her 24th birthday.

Eva Pinkelnig

- Eva Pinkelnig has finished in a podium position in each of the first four individual events of this season, including a win in Wisla. Her third place in Wisla was her first World Cup individual podium finish since February 2020 (second in Ljubno ob Savinji).
- In Wisla, Pinkelnig (age 34) became the second oldest female ski jumper to win an individual World Cup event, behind Daniela Iraschko-Stolz (three wins at age 35). In Wisla, Pinkelnig was more than twice the age of the youngest finisher, Tamara Mesíková (age 16).
- Pinkelnig's previous three individual World Cup victories had all come in Japan.

Other contenders

- **Katharina Althaus** has two individual podium finishes in 2022/23 (first in Lillehammer, second in Wisla). Althaus can become the first German female ski jumper to win an individual World Cup event in Germany.
- Althaus has 39 individual World Cup podium finishes, only three fewer than all other female German ski jumpers combined (42).
- **Sara Marita Kramer** won the 2021/22 overall World Cup, becoming the second Austrian female ski jumper to claim the overall crystal globe after Daniela Iraschko-Stolz in 2014/15.
- Kramer (15) is one short of moving joint-third alongside Daniela Iraschko-Stolz (16) for most individual World Cup wins by a female ski jumper. The top two are Sara Takanashi (63) and Maren Lundby (30).
- The only previous season Titisee-Neustadt hosted events in the women's World Cup was in 2020/21. Both of the two events were won by Kramer.
- **Sara Takanashi** (63) has won more individual World Cup events than any other female ski jumper. The most recent of those victories was in March 2022 in Oslo. Takanashi's best result in 2022/23 is a fifth place in Wisla.
- **Anna Odine Strøm** gained a second place in Lillehammer. She will be looking to win her first individual World Cup event.

- **Frida Westman** claimed Sweden's first individual World Cup podium finish in Wisla (third).
- **Emma Klinec** took a third place finish in the World Cup event in Titisee-Neustadt on 30 January 2021. She has claimed six of her 16 World Cup individual podium finishes at German events.
- **Nika Križnar** won the overall World Cup in 2020/21. She can become the third female ski jumper to claim multiple overall World Cups, after Sara Takanashi (4) and Maren Lundby (3). Križnar's best individual finish this season is a fourth place in Wisla.
- **Maren Lundby** made her return to the World Cup circuit in Wisla. Her 16th place in the first individual World Cup event of 2022/23 is her highest finish of the season.
- Only Takanashi (63) has won as many individual World Cup events as Lundby (30) among female ski jumpers. Lundby's last individual World Cup victory dates back to 10 March 2020 in Lillehammer.
