

PREVIEW MEN'S TEAM SPRINT LARGE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS Saturday 6 Mar 2021

- This event will be staged at the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships
- for the fifth time, having made its competition debut in 2013.
- France won the first two instalments of this event at world championships and Germany won the last two.
- Germany is the only country to have won a medal in this event on all previous four occasions it was staged at the world championships (G2-S1-B1).
- Eric Frenzel is the only individual to have won four world championship medals in this event, teaming with Tino Edelmann in 2013, with Johannes Rydzek in 2015 and 2017 and with Fabian Rießle in 2019.
- Frenzel can win his third world title in this event, surpassing Jason Lamy Chappuis (2) for most world titles in this event.
- Ahead of the men's large hill/10 km event, Frenzel had claimed 16 medals in Nordic world championships (G7-S7-B2). In all sports, only Bjørn Dæhlie (17, cross-country skiing) had claimed more medals at Nordic world championships.
- Ahead of the men's large hill/10 km event, Jarl Magnus Riiber had won gold in each of the last four men's events at the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships.
- In 2017 in Lahti, Japan (bronze) became the first, and so far only, non-European country to win a medal in this event at the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships.
