

## PREVIEW MEN'S SUPER-G GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN – Saturday and Sunday 27-28 Jan 2024

### Marco Odermatt

- Marco Odermatt is leading the World Cup standings in overall, downhill, super-G and giant slalom this season. He finished on the podium in all three super-G events he started in (3rd-1st-2nd).
- Only Hermann Maier (24), Aksel Lund Svindal (17) and Kjetil Jansrud (13) won as many super-G World Cup events as Odermatt (11).
- Odermatt (32 wins) can enter the top 10 of most individual World Cup wins in men's events. Bode Miller is in 10th place on 33 wins.
- Odermatt finished on the podium in each of the last 12 super-G World Cup events (7 wins, 3 second places and 2 third places). He took third place in his only super-G start in Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 6 February 2021.
- Odermatt (12) can set the outright longest men's podium streak in World Cup super-G appearances. Hermann Maier also claimed 12 successive podium finishes from January 2001 to November 2004.

### Other Contenders

- **Cyprien Sarrazin** won the super-G event in Wengen on 12 January. It was his first podium finish in a World Cup super-G.
- Sarrazin won three of the last four speed events in the World Cup, including his first victory in a super-G, in Wengen.
- Sarrazin has won four speed events in the World Cup. Among French men only Luc Alphand (12) and Jean-Claude Killy (6) won more speed events.
- Sarrazin can join Alphand (2) and Franck Piccard (2) as French men on multiple World Cup super-G wins.
- **Vincent Kriechmayr** won the super-G in Val Gardena on 15 December. It was his eighth win in an super-G World Cup event.
- Kriechmayr won the most recent super-G World Cup event in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, on 6 February 2021.
- The only men to have won multiple super-G World Cups in Garmisch-Partenkirchen were Hermann Maier (3) and Christoph Gruber (3).
- **Dominik Paris** won the downhill World Cup in Garmisch-Partenkirchen in February 2021. The last man to win a downhill and super-G in Garmisch-Partenkirchen was Erik Guay (downhill in 2007, super-G in 2010).
- **James Crawford** is the reigning world champion in the men's super-G. Crawford has yet to win a World Cup event. His only podium finish in a World Cup super-G event was a second place in Kvitfjell on 6 March 2022.
