

PREVIEW WOMEN'S INDIVIDUAL LARGE HILL LAHTI – Friday 1 Mar 2024

Eva Pinkelnig

- Eva Pinkelnig won the previous two individual World Cup events, in Hinzenbach on 24 and 25 February. The last woman to win at least three successive individual World Cup events was Sara Marita Kramer in December 2021 (4).
- Among Austrian women, only Daniela Iraschko-Stolz (16) and Kramer (15) have won as many individual World Cup events as Pinkelnig (14).
- Pinkelnig can become the first Austrian woman to win an individual World Cup event in Lahti. Both previous events were won by women representing Japan: Sara Takanashi in February 2016 and Yuki Ito in March 2023.
- No woman has won as many individual World Cup events in 2024 as Pinkelnig (5). Nika Prevc follows on four victories.
- Pinkelnig (5) is one short of equalling her total number of individual World Cup victories of last season (6, personal best), when she won the overall World Cup.
- Pinkelnig won two individual World Cup large hill events this season, in Oberstdorf on 1 January and in Sapporo on 13 January.

Nika Prevc

- Eighteen-year-old Nika Prevc (6 wins in 2023/24) can become the youngest woman to win at least seven individual World Cup events in a season since Sara Takanashi's 15 wins at age 17 in 2013/14.
- Only Sara Takanashi (3) won as many women's individual World Cup events on the large hill before turning 19 as Prevc (2). Prevc won the large hill event in Engelberg (16 December) and Garmisch-Partenkirchen (30 December) this World Cup season.
- In the Prevc family, Nika is level with her brother Domen Prevc on six individual World Cup career wins. Their brother Peter Prevc is still sitting at the head of the family dinner table on 23 individual World Cup wins
- Nika has yet to celebrate an individual World Cup victory in the same weekend as one of her brothers.
- Coming into this weekend, only one Slovenian ski jumper (male or female) has won an individual World Cup event in Lahti: Primož Peterka in March 1998.

Other contenders

- Only Maren Lundby (10) has claimed more individual women's World Cup wins on large hills than **Sara Marita Kramer** (9) and **Sara Takanashi** (9).
- Takanashi won one of the two women's individual World Cup events in Lathi, in February 2016. Compatriot **Yuki Ito** won the other (in March 2023).
- This season, the nine women's individual World Cup large hill events had six different winners: Joséphine Pagnier (2), Nika Prevc (2), Eva Pinkelnig (2), Yuki Ito, Jacqueline Seifriedsberger and Silje Opseth.
- **Silje Opseth** won the most recent World Cup large hill event, in Willingen on 4 February. She can become the second Norwegian woman to win successive individual World Cup events on the large hill, after Maren Lundby (5 in March-December 2019, 3 in January-February 2019).
- Opseth can become the fourth woman this World Cup season to win back-to-back large hill events, after Pagnier, Prevc and Pinkelnig. Prior to this season, just five women managed to win successive large hill World Cup events.
- **Yuki Ito** claimed four individual World Cup victories on the large hill, compared to five individual World Cup wins on the normal hill.
- **Alexandria Loutitt** (5) and **Eirin Maria Kvandal** (5) are the two women to have recorded the most individual World Cup podiums this season without winning once.
- Both of **Joséphine Pagnier's** individual World Cup victories came on the large hill, in Lillehammer on 3 December 2023 and in Engelberg 12 days later.
- **Jacqueline Seifriedsberger** claimed three podiums in her last four World Cup events (1st-8th-2nd-3rd).
