

PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER G CORTINA D'AMPEZZO – Sunday 28 Jan 2024

Cornelia Hütter

- Cornelia Hütter finished inside the top-4 in all four World Cup super-G events this season (2nd, 4th, 1st, 2nd).
- Hütter can record three successive World Cup super-G podium finishes for the first time. This is the fifth time she has a run of two successive podium finishes.
- Hütter has recorded two World Cup podium finishes in Italy, a second place in the La Thuile downhill on 19 February 2016 and a second place in the most recent super-G event in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 22 January 2023.

Lara Gut-Behrami

- Lara Gut-Behrami can become the first woman to win successive World Cup super-G events, since she won four in a row herself in January-February 2021.
- Gut-Behrami only won more World Cup super-G events in Garmisch-Partenkirchen (4) and Lake Louise (3) than in Cortina d'Ampezzo (2, 2014 and 2018).
- Lindsey Vonn (6) and Renate Götschl (5) are the only women with more than two World Cup super-G wins in Cortina d'Ampezzo.
- Reigning super-G Olympic champion Gut-Behrami won the super-G world championship held in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 11 February 2021.

Other contenders

- The last six World Cup super-G events in Cortina d'Ampezzo were won by six different women: Lindsey Vonn (2016), Ilka Štuhec (2017), Lara Gut-Behrami (2018), Mikaela Shiffrin (2019), Elena Curtoni (2022) and Ragnhild Mowinckel (2023).
- Federica Brignone or Sofia Goggia could become the third Italian woman to win the World Cup super-G event in Cortina d'Ampezzo, following Isolde Kostner (1997) and Elena Curtoni (2022).
- Brignone (9) is aiming to become the seventh woman to win at least 10
 World Cup super-G events, following Lindsey Vonn (28), Lara Gut-Behrami
 (20), Renate Götschl (17), Katja Seizinger (16), Carole Merle (12) and
 Michaela Dorfmeister (10).
- Brignone has already won World Cup events on Italian snow in Kronplatz, Sestriere and Val di Fassa, but has yet to win in Cortina d'Ampezzo. Her best result here is a fourth place in the women's super-G on 23 January 2022.
- Goggia has won six World Cup super-G events, but never in Cortina d'Ampezzo. Her best World Cup super-G result here is a second place on 29 January 2017.





- Ragnhild Mowinckel won the most recent World Cup super-G event in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 22 January 2023. She can become the first woman with successive wins here since Lindsey Vonn won in 2015 and 2016.
- Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (two second places) is the only woman on multiple podium finishes in super-G events without winning once this World Cup season.
