Medical Person - Doctor - SOS People	1-2 minimum at start–either ski or skidoo (qualified in Advanced Cardiac- or Trauma Life Support, ACLS/ALS). 2 in any case During Live TV. 4-6 two groups of 2 persons + 1 sledge if one crew have to leave the second remains at the start (qualified in ALS/ACLS and/or paramedic with capability in advanced airway management) (According to FIS MEDICAL GUIDE)
Score/Results Board - Finish	2 to write down ranks – radios from OC

Fencing	1 m crowd control fence on both sides of the course to separate the course from the general public. B-net and safety measurement equipment as needed!
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Start Inflatable	Provided by ASS (dimensions according to FIS Sponsoring Guide)
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Dye	Blue for colouring features (minimum 4 pumps and 4 skiers to do the dying, pumps must dye constant 15-25 cm wide lines)
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Snow preparation	If necessary we use fertilizer, regular-salt and water.
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Official Notice Board Scoreboard	A suitable board in the finish area (marked as “OFFICIAL NOTICE BOARD”) - close to the exit gate (minimum 2 x 2 meters) to post results, heat sheets, jury decisions, etc. and to write down times/rank during Qualification and Finals. A suitable board in the start area (minimum 1 x 2 meters) to post official results, jury decisions, information and to write down scores during Qualifications and Finals.
Start Tent	Available for competitors – recommended 10 x 5 meters, closed, secured and heated
Drinking water	Hot tea and cold water (without gas) during training and competition for competitors.
Toilets	1 toilet located close (100m) to start area (portable toilets).
Sound System Speaker DJ	Specifications as per sound company and local situation For all training- and competition days music is required. English is required and respective national language – two speakers are recommended (also for training, qualifications and awards) who are aware of the sports ins and outs. Musical selection depends on the audience and local habits, but should be related to snowboard
Communication / Radios	OC provides 14 radios to run the competition (according to FIS radio list) OC needs extra radios for internal communication.
Ski Doo’s	A minimum of 4 ski doo’s (with drivers) are necessary for the finals in SBS or a suitable lift just beside the SBS.
TV system for Judging	Support for judges to do video judging: 2 big screens in the judges stand and feed from TV production that covers the entire course with adequate technical images (athletes entire run including in-run, rails, airtime, landing, etc.)
Judges Stand/ Data Building Internet Connection	A heated lockable building/container with power (separate electric circuit) and tables and chairs for 6 people + 3 Swiss Timing (minimum 20 square meters) with windows. FIS data processing company (Swiss Timing) will provide more details. High speed, separate and stable Internet connection (preferable wired connection) required for live scoring data transfer!
