

PREVIEW WOMEN'S TEAM NORMAL HILL WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS PLANICA – Saturday 25 Feb 2023

Austria

- Austria is the reigning world champion in this event, winning ahead of Slovenia (2nd) and Norway (3rd) in Oberstdorf in 2021. Austria finished second in this event in 2019, behind Germany.
- Austria won five of the 10 women's team events in the World Cup (including the super team event) since it was introduced in 2017. It won five of the last six events.
- The women's team/super team events have been staged 12 times in the World Cup (10) and at the world championships (2) combined. No country claimed as many podium finishes as Austria (G6-S2-B2). Austria only failed to record a podium finish in the first two World Cup events, back in 2017/18.
- **Chiara Kreuzer** was part of all six winning Austrian teams in team/super team events in the World Cup and at the world championships combined. She was involved in all 12 women's team/super team events Austria competed in.
- **Sara Marita Kramer** won five team events with Austria in the World Cup/world championships. She did not compete in this season's World Cup super team event in Zao in January, when Eva Pinkelnig teamed up with Kreuzer to win the event.

Other contenders

- **Germany** won the world title in the women's team event in 2019 in Seefeld, ahead of Austria (2nd) and Norway (3rd). Germany finished fifth in 2021.
- Germany (2) is one of three countries to have claimed multiple World Cup victories in the women's team/super team events, alongside Austria (5) and Japan (2).
- **Katharina Althaus** (4) is the woman to have won the most gold medals in team events (women's/mixed) at the world championships.
- **Slovenia** recorded six World Cup podium finishes in this event (G1-S4-B1), but only one resulted in a win: on home snow in Ljubno ob Savinji on 23 January 2021.
- World Cups and world championships combined, only Austria (10) claimed more podium finishes in the women's team/super team events than Slovenia (7, G1-S5-B1).
- Slovenia finished second in this event at the world championships in 2021, behind Austria.
- **Nika Križnar** and Špela Rogelj were part of all seven Slovenian teams that finished on a World Cup or world championships podium in this event. Rogelj retired from ski jumping at the end of last season.



- **Norway** recorded six podium finishes in the women's team/super team events in the World Cup and world championships, but it has yet to claim a win. It took bronze medals in both world championships.
