

## Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26

## Men's Super G Livigno stat sheet

- After three men's Super G races of the 2025/26 World Cup season, Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) leads the World Cup Super G standings with 225 points, ahead of Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head, 209) in 2nd and Raphael Haaser (AUT/Atomic, 146) in 3rd.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) leads the overall World Cup standings after the Val Gardena / Alta Badia week with 805 points. Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer, 360) is 2nd, while Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic, 358) is in 3rd place.
- Jan Zabystran (CZE/Kaestle) won the third Super G race of the season in Val Gardena on 19 December, ahead of Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) in second and Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol) in third.
- Jan Zabystran (CZE/Kaestle) claimed his first career World Cup win in Val Gardena. He had only one top-10 finish before, an 8th place in Kvitfjell Super G in March 2025.
- Jan Zabystran (CZE/Kaestle) claimed the first World Cup win for Czech men in any discipline. This was only the third podium for the Czech men's team, with the two other top-3 finishes belonging to Ondrej Bank, both in combined events.
- It's the second time a nation has recorded its first victory on the men's Alpine skiing World Cup tour this season. Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic) did it earlier this year for Brazil in the Levi Slalom.
- Marco Odermatt's (SUI/Stöckli) 2nd place finish in Val Gardena allowed him to claim outright 3rd place on the men's all-time list with 27 World Cup Super G podiums. He is chasing Hermann Maier (AUT, 38) and Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR, 30) in the top two positions on this list.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) can join Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR) in second place on the men's all-time World Cup Super G winners list with a victory. Odermatt has 16 Super G World Cup wins, one behind Svindal and eight behind Hermann Maier (AUT), who leads the field with 24 wins.
- Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol) claimed his first career Alpine World Cup podium in Val Gardena. His previous personal best finish was 4th place in Beaver Creek Super G in December 2024.
- Christof Innerhofer (ITA/Rossignol) was 6th in Val Gardena, his best finish in any World Cup race since he came 5th in the Garmisch-Partenkirchen Super G in February 2021.
- Only four athletes have finished inside the top 10 of every Super G race of the 2025/26
  World Cup season: Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli), Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head),
  Raphael Haaser (AUT/Atomic) and Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer).

- Two French athletes featured in the top 5 in the Val Gardena Super G: Nils Allegre (FRA/Salomon, 4th) and Matthieu Bailet (FRA/Head, 5th). The previous time two Frenchmen were in the top 5 of a World Cup Super G race was in Beaver Creek in December 2017, when Adrien Theaux (FRA/Salomon) and Alexis Pinturault (FRA/Head) also finished 4th and 5th, respectively.
- **Livigno** will host a stage of the Alpine Skiing World Cup for the first time in its history. The Tagliede Li Zeta slope, starting at 2,375 meters, will lead the athletes to the town center finish line at 1,850 meters.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) can extend his record streak of men's top-10 World Cup Super G finishes. The Swiss skier has finished inside the top 10 in his last 27 World Cup Super G races dating back to the race in Courchevel/Meribel in March 2022. In that time he has claimed 12 wins and 20 podium finishes.
- A win in Livigno would see Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head) claim outright third place on the list of Austrian World Cup Super G winners, men or women. He is currently equal third with Michaela Dorfmeister (AUT) on 10 wins. Hermann Maier (AUT) heads the list with 24 Super G World Cup wins, with Renate Goetschl (AUT) in second place with 17.
- Christof Innerhofer (ITA/Rossignol) will make his 112th World Cup Super G start to set a record for men or women. He is currently equal with Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head) on 111.
- Christof Innerhofer (ITA/Rossignol) has made 344 World Cup starts in all disciplines since his debut in 2006/07. Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol, 359) and Peter Fill (ITA, 355) are the only two Italians with more World Cup starts.
- The last time an Italian athlete won a World Cup Super G race in Italy was at Val Gardena in December 2024, when Mattia Casse (ITA/Rossignol) won his first ever World Cup race.
- There have been eight Super G races on Italian slopes in the course of the last four World Cup seasons. Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) has won half of them, claiming a podium spot seven times. The only time Odermatt failed to step on the podium was last season's Bormio Super G, where he finished 5th.
