

## FACTS & FIGURES – Men's Super G World Cup Finals, Sun Valley

- Men's Super G Crystal Globe season standings: 1. Marco Odermatt (491);

- This is the first time the men will race a World Cup Super G in Sun Valley.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) has already clinched his third straight Super G Crystal Globe.
- Odermatt is the fifth man to win three or more Super G season titles, joining Kjetil Jansrud (NOR) on three. Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR) and Hermann Maier (AUT) share the men's record with five Super G globes, while Pirmin Zurbriggen (SUI) won four.
- Odermatt is the first man since Svindal from 2012-14 to win three Super G globes in a row. Maier holds the men's record with four Super G globes in a row from 1998-2001.
- If Odermatt finishes in the top three in Sun Valley, he would join Jansrud on 26 World Cup Super G podiums, which would be equal third on the men's all-time list behind Maier (38) and Svindal (30).
- Odermatt has finished inside the top seven in his last 23 World Cup Super G races dating back to March 2022, making the podium in 18 of them.
- Odermatt entered the World Cup Finals with 45 World Cup wins in all disciplines, and could equal or surpass Marc Giradelli (LUX, 46), who is fifth on the men's all-time list.
- Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head) currently sits in 2nd in the Super G standings, 10 points ahead of Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer) and 19 points ahead of Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica), with second-place finishes in Bormio and Wengen earlier this season.
- Kriechmayr has won nine World Cup Super G races and can become the sixth man to win 10, behind Maier (24), Svindal (17), Odermatt (15), Jansrud (13) and Zurbriggen (10).
- Entering World Cup Finals, Kriechmayr had nine World Cup wins in both Super G and Downhill. With an extra win in each discipline, he would become the 11th man to achieve the 'double-double' of double-figure (10+) wins in two disciplines.
- He would become the fourth man to do the speed double-double after Maier (24 SG, 15 DH), Svindal (17 SG, 14 DH) and Zurbriggen (10 SG, 10 DH).
- The most recent World Cup Super G in Kvitfjell marked the first time this season no Swiss skier has finished on the podium.
- Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer) is one of three Swiss skiers, along with Odermatt and Alexis Monney (Stöckli), to have claimed at least two podium finishes.
- In seven races this season, Rogentin has finished outside the top-seven just twice, grabbing two third-place finishes along the way (Wengen and Kitzbühel).

- Should Rogentin finish 3rd in the Crystal Globe standings it will represent his best ever finish in any discipline.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** claimed his fifth Super G World Cup win last time out in Kvitfjell and his first for almost six years.
- One more World Cup win will take Paris to 25 in total, equal with Ted Ligety (USA) on the all-time winners list.
- Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head) won the Super G in Wengen in January, his first World Cup victory. His 13th place in Kvitfjell was the first time in five Super G races he had finished outside the top seven.
- Despite currently sitting 6th in the standings, von Allmen is only 27 points behind 2nd-placed Kriechmayr.
- Von Allmen's previous best finish in a Crystal Globe race was 14th in last season's Super G.
- Alexis Monney's (SUI/Stöckli) is 7th in the standings and is still only 41 points off second place.
- Both Monney's career Super G podium finishes have come this season (2nd in Crans Montana and 3rd in Bormio).
- His best ever Super G Crystal Globe finish was 42nd last season.
- In the absence of injured Mattia Casse (ITA/Rossignol) **Fredrik Moeller** (**NOR/Atomic**) is the only skier in the field other than Odermatt, von Allmen and Paris to have won a Super G this season - the first and to date only World Cup triumph of his career.
- The Norwegian started off the season with two 4th place finishes and that win (in Bormio). But since then he has a best finish of 13th.
- Moeller sits 8th in the standings, 47 points behind 2nd-placed Kriechmayr. His previous best Crystal Globe finish was 42nd in Giant Slalom last season.
