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MINUTES OF THE PROCEEDINGS

ITEM 1 OPENING OF THE CONGRESS

President Johan Eliasch opened the 56th International Ski Congress on 13th June 2025 and welcomed all Congress delegates, Council Members and those joining online via the live stream on the FIS You Tube Channel.

Opening Speech by FIS President Johan Eliasch

“Dear ski and snowboard friends,

I’m happy to welcome you to this 56th International Ski Congress.

It’s a pleasure to be here in Geneva together with the FIS Council members and to connect with all of you, our representatives of ski and snowboard around the world.

I always say that this Congress is not only the highest authority in snow sports – it is a symbol of how we should work to achieve success and growth: together.

Before we move on to the many important discussions and decisions of today, I would like to invite you to take a moment to honor the members of the ski and snowboard family that have sadly left us over the last 12 months.

To their memory, a moment of silence.”

Following the welcome speech from President Eliasch a housekeeping update was provided by video in direct relation to the online meeting procedures.

Dr. Stephan Netzle provided a full legal briefing on voting and general Congress procedures in accordance with the FIS Statutes.

The Congress acknowledged the opening speech from Johan Eliasch and the housekeeping and legal information.

ITEM 5 AFFILIATION AND EXCLUSION OF MEMBER ASSOCIATIONS

Secretary General Vion informed the FIS Congress, that the Council proposed the following National Ski Associations as Members

CAN Canada Ski and Snowboard, Full Member

BEN Association Sportive de Ski D'Aboerney-Calavi, Associate Member

BHU Bhutan Olympic Committee, Associate Member

INA Komite Olimpiade Indonesia, Associate Member

Secretary General Vion informed the FIS Congress, that Canada had been a FIS member through the Canadian Ski Association but had withdrawn their membership which had been acknowledged by the FIS Council on 16th April 2025. Therefore, the new organisation to represent Canada – Canada Ski and Snowboard – which qualifies as full member with three (3) votes needs to be approved by the FIS Congress.

The Congress approved the four new members.

Furthermore, two Associate Members qualified to become Full Members:

AZE Azerbaijan Winter Sports Federation

KSA Saudi Winter Sports Federation

On request of the Armenian Delegate, Gagik Sargysan the change of membership was voted on individually for each Association.

The Congress approved Azerbaijan with 121 votes in favour and 1 against, and approved Canada and Saudi Arabia unanimously as Full Members.

Following the approval of the new Full Members a Mini Roll Call took place for Azerbaijan, Canada and Saudi Arabia.

ITEM 6 THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS ORDINARY CONGRESS (2024)

The draft FIS Congress 2024 Minutes were sent to the National Ski Associations in July 2024 with the request for feedback and comments.

The finalised and certified minutes of the 55th International Ski Congress had been submitted to the National Ski Associations on 29th October 2024. This version did not take into consideration the amended election results as per information of 11th June 2024. Therefore, the Minutes of the 55th International Ski Congress had been updated accordingly and sent to the National Ski Associations together with the Statutory documents for the FIS Congress 2025.

The Congress **approved** the Minutes of the 55th International Ski Congress that took place in Reykjavik (ISL).

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ITEM 7 REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

The report of President Eliasch was presented with a video message.

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ITEM 8 THE FIS STATUTES

President Eliasch referred to the Congress Book containing the proposals submitted by the Member Associations and by the FIS Council as well as a further package which included the withdrawal of some proposals, the amendment of proposals related to the FIS Statutes as one substantive new proposal.

The amendments as well as the substantive new proposal had been approved by the FIS Council to be dealt with during the FIS Congress 2025.

The FIS Council proposed to vote on all the proposals in section A in one total package by show of hands unless a member wished to request individual votes on each section.

Stephan Netzle explained the details of the procedure.

The Congress approved to vote on the proposals regarding the FIS Statutes in one single package by show of hands, which was then undertaken and the proposals were approved.

The Congress approved the following FIS Statute amendments in one single vote:

Communication of voting cast

10.8.2. For the purposes of any form of Congress, in principle voting shall be conducted by way of an Electronic Voting system. The voting process shall remain secret only if the Congress so decides by majority of all votes cast at the request of a delegate or a Council Member. After each voting the respective valid voting cast (e.g. the

concrete numbers of "YES", "NO" and "ABSTENTIONS") shall be communicated to the Congress.

10.11. Minutes

- 10.11.1. The Secretary General shall be responsible for the Minutes of the Congress which must be verified by one (1) certifier. In the case of resolutions and elections, the minutes shall contain the respective valid voting cast (e.g. the concrete numbers of "YES", "NO" and "ABSTENTIONS"). The Secretary General sends the minutes and a summary of the decisions and action points of the Congress to the Member Associations as soon as possible, however, no later than 90 days after the last day of the respective Congress. The minutes have to be approved by the next Congress.

Reporting the duties of the President and the Secretary General

- 13.1.7 The President shall inform the Council on the current activities of FIS in a written report in each Council Meeting, at minimum once every three (3) months.
- 13.1.8 The President shall report to the Congress on the current activities of FIS in a written report.
- 14.2.4. Supporting the President and the Council in working with the FIS stakeholders

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Responsibilities of the Executive Committee

Proposal to the Congress to remove the Executive Committee function, and all references to it in the FIS Statutes.

Minutes of the Council Meetings and the Executive Committee Meetings

- 11.4.1.4 The Secretary General takes the minutes of the Council Meetings. In the case of resolutions and elections, the minutes shall contain the respective valid voting cast (e.g. the concrete numbers of "YES", "NO" and "ABSTENTIONS"). The Secretary General sends the minutes and a summary of the decisions and actions of each Council Meeting to the Council Members as soon as possible, not later, however, than within seven (7) days of the respective Council Meeting. The Council Members should be entitled to submit comments on the minutes and request amendments within five (5) days. However, matters of confidential nature, commercially sensitive information and any such information which is subject to data protection rights may not be published, provided the Council decides to this effect at its meeting. The

minutes shall be approved at the next Council Meeting, taking into account the submissions and amendments proposed by the Council Members. Those minutes shall be published within fourteen (14) days of the Council Meeting.

- 12.3.4 Proposal withdrawn if Congress votes to remove the Executive Committee function

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FIS Council and Executive Committee rules and authorities of the Council

11. The Council
The Council is accountable to the Congress and is the supreme authority of the FIS between the Congress meetings. The Council meetings will be conducted in accordance with the FIS Council and Executive Committee rules, which must be confirmed at the first Council Meeting following the election of the Council Members.
- 11.3. Authority, Duties and Responsibilities
- 11.3.3.10 to award FIS World Championships, FIS Games, and any other FIS event that combines three (3) or more FIS disciplines as one (1) commercial offering;
- 11.3.3.15. to ensure that the Statutes, the FIS Rules and Regulations, FIS Council and Executive Committee rules, Conflict of Interest policies and the decisions of the Council are updated and observed;

Clarity on appointments by the Council

- 11.3.4. The Council appoints the following persons:
- 11.3.4.5. the chairpersons and members of the Standing Committees and Expert Committees upon proposal of the President, subject to the specific rules as set out in these Statutes (in particular as per Article 15.2.1.4. regarding the appointment of the chairperson of the Athletes Commission);
- 15.2.1. The Athletes Commission
- 15.2.1.4. The chairperson of the Athletes Commission is appointed by the members of the Athletes Commission by a majority vote (for the avoidance of doubt, Article 11.3.4.5. does not apply).

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Financial year of FIS

- 18.1 Unless Congress decides otherwise, the financial year of FIS for budgetary purpose is one (1) year, beginning on May 1st and ending on April 30th of the next year, with effect as of May 1st 2026.

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The Finance Committee and the Nomination and Remuneration Committee

15.2.2. The Finance Committee

15.2.2.1. The Finance Committee shall:

- a) review the budget proposal and present it with its recommendations to the Council. Once approved by the Council, the annual budget will be distributed in writing to the Member Associations no later than 21 (twenty-one) days before the Congress; and
- b) Review the annual accounts – namely the statutory accounts and consolidated accounts – and provide for its comments before they are submitted to the Congress for approval; and. -
- c) monitor the financial situation of FIS throughout the year

15.2.5.2 The Nomination and Remuneration Committee shall:

- c) periodic review of Policies governing recruitment, training, and remuneration
- d) inform the Council regarding activities and provide an annual activity report to the Congress.

15.2.5.3 The President is not a member of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee.

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Extraordinary Congress as in-person meeting

- 10.4.4. All Extraordinary Congress shall, in principle, be held by videoconferencing and conducted in English and the minutes thereof shall be recorded in English. In the event that (2/3) two thirds of votes of the Member Associations agree in the proposal asking for an Extraordinary Congress, an Extraordinary Congress shall be held as a physical meeting.

Definitions:

Extraordinary Congress means a Congress which is called by the Council upon an urgent proposal supported by 2/3 (two thirds) of all Council Members or 1/5 (one-fifth or 20%) of Member Associations. Extraordinary Congress meetings are held by videoconferencing unless otherwise determined as per Article 10.4.4.

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ITEM 9 PROPOSALS BY THE MEMBER ASSOCIATIONS AND THE FIS COUNCIL RELATED TO THE RULES

Proposal 9.1 Prize Money in EUR was submitted to the Congress by Austria Germany, Norway, Switzerland and the USA

Background / Reason

As well known, prize money is fixed by the FIS Council in the currency of CHF. As the official currency of many organizers is EUR, however, the currency "EUR" should be used in that regard. This would exclude the risk of changing exchange rates for many athletes.

Wording

The Congress shall resolve that the FIS Council shall fix the amounts of the prize money in the currency of EUR with immediate effect.

The Congress approved the proposal.

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Proposal 9.2 Increase of prize money was brought forward to the Congress by Austria, German, Norway, Switzerland and the USA

Background / Reason

GER/NOR/SUI/USA

The FIS apparently promised the athletes that the prize money would be increased. The NSAs support this proposal in principle. The prize money is on a stable level since many years. We assume that the prize money should be increased by 30% (in all disciplines). But it must be avoided that NSAs or Local Organisers end up having to pay more as well.

AUT:

The prize money is on a stable level since many years. We assume that the prize money should be increased by 30% (in all disciplines).

Wording

GER/NOR/SUI/USA

The Congress shall requests further information from the President and the Council on how to increase the prize money and how this increase in prize money can be achieved without a financial burden on the NSAs or Local Organisers.

AUT

The Congress shall resolve that the FIS Council shall increase the prize money by 30% for all disciplines.

The National Ski Associations withdrew the proposal.

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ITEM 10 PROPOSALS BY THE MEMBER ASSOCIATIONS NOT DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE STATUTES OR THE RULES

Proposal 10.1 Request for an audited business plan was submitted to the Congress by Austria.

Background / Reason

With regard to financial good governance, the FIS statutes, inter alia, provide that a "Finance Committee" and "Audit Committee" shall be established and that a "Treasurer" shall be appointed. Unfortunately, neither of such committees has been established in accordance with the FIS statutes nor was a "Treasurer" appointed since the last election of Council members during the FIS Congress 2024, respectively.

Due to the lack of these committees/positions, it is to be assumed that there is no sufficient financial control in place at the moment and that the statutory framework is not complied with. We believe, however, that FIS's financial standing is of utmost importance for future developments of our beloved sports. In the light of the massive recent FIS spendings, in particular in the context of centralization and recent legal disputes, and the lack of the said committees/functions, an audited business plan (including future cash flows, contracted and non contracted revenue and expenses, future B/L) for the next olympic cycle (i.e. 2026-2030) is requested in order to provide clarity for the future.

Wording

The Congress shall resolve that FIS management must provide to FIS Council and the Member Associations a written business plan (including future cash flows, contracted and non contracted revenue and expenses, as well as projected profit and loss accounts) for the next olympic cycle (i.e. 2026-2030), which is to be audited by PricewaterhouseCoopers AG as a neutral, impartial, well-known and respected auditor firm, no later than 31 December 2025.

In addition, such auditor shall also review whether the lack of a "Finance Committee", "Audit Committee" and a lack of the position of the "Treasurer" (since the last election of Council members during the FIS Congress 2024, respectively) will have negative consequences for FIS and its member associations.

The National Ski Association withdrew the proposal based on the agreement that FIS will provide a financial forecast including consolidated revenues, operating profit and net profit for the period 2026/2027 – 2029/2030 which has been reviewed by the Finance Committee in to the Member Associations until 15th September 2025 at the latest.

The overview on the Accounts was presented with a video message of Chief Financial and Administrative Officer Ruf with some additional information on the Financial distribution and the Net Profit for the last 10 years.

The Congress approved the accounts for the financial period 2024.

The FIS Council and its Finance Committee proposed to keep the annual subscriptions and calendar fees based on the fees approved for the period 2024/2025.

The Congress approved the Annual Subscriptions, Calendar Fees and other financial obligations for the period 2025/2026.

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ITEM 15 BUDGET FOR THE NEXT FINANCIAL PERIOD

Chief Financial and Administrative Officer Ruf presented the consolidated budget for the financial year 2026 as well as an updated forecast for 2025.

The Congress approved the Budget for the financial year 2026.

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President Eliasch presented an overview of the Financial Support for the financial year 2025. The special distribution of CHF 7.5 million is subject to approval by the Congress.

The Congress approved the special distribution of CHF 7.5 million.

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ITEM 16 APPOINTMENT OF EXTERNAL AUDIT COMPANY

The FIS Council and its Audit Committee proposed Ernst & Young AG Bern as the external audit company for the financial period 2025.

The Congress approved Ernst & Young AG as the auditors for the accounts 2025.

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ITEM 17 REPRESENTATIVES IN THE FIS COUNCIL AND MEMBERS OF FIS STANDING COMMITTEES

17.1 Confirmation of Para Athletes' Representative as FIS Council Member

The FIS Council proposed Dani Aravich (USA) as female Para Athletes' Representative in the FIS Council.

The Congress approved the appointment of Dani Aravich to the FIS Council.

17.2 Appointment IECO

The FIS Council proposed to re-appoint the Head of Sport, Quest as the Independent Ethics and Compliance Officer for the term 1st June 2025 to 31s May 2027.

The Congress approved the re-appointment of the Head of Sport, Quest as IECO.

The FIS Council will decide at its Autumn Meeting 2025 when and where the FIS Congress 2028 will be held.

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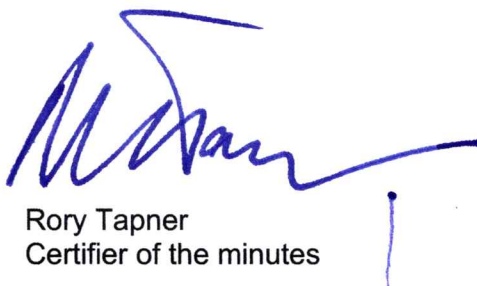
