

FACTS & FIGURES – Women’s Super G in La Thuile (Thursday and Friday)

- **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** has won 36 World Cup races in all disciplines and can win her 37th to equal Marlies Schild (AUT) in eighth place on the women's all-time list.
 - Brignone can win her 13th World Cup Super G race, which would put her in outright fifth place on the women's all-time list. She is currently tied in fifth on 12 wins with Carole Merle (FRA).
 - Brignone has 24 World Cup Super G podiums. If she makes the podium in both La Thuile races, she will reach 26 to equal Michaela Dorfmeister (AUT) in equal fifth place on the women's all-time list.
 - Brignone has finished in the top five in the last 15 World Cup races in all disciplines that she has completed (with two DNFs in that span). Her last completed race outside the top five was the Beaver Creek Downhill in December, when she finished ninth.
 - Brignone has been in the top five in all six Super G races this season and on the podium in the last four, including two victories.
 - If Brignone wins one of the La Thuile races, she will win three World Cup Super G races in one season for the second time (after 2022). If she wins both, she will win four World Cup Super G races in one season for the first time.
 - Brignone came second to Nina Ortlieb (AUT) in the last World Cup Super G race to be held in La Thuile, in February 2020.
- **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** can win her 47th World Cup race to move into outright fifth position on the women's all-time list. She is currently tied on 46 with Renate Götschl (AUT).
 - If she reaches the podium in both races in La Thuile and Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head) does not reach it in either race, Gut-Behrami will tie Vonn with 46 World Cup Super G podiums, more than any other skier in either gender.
 - Gut-Behrami has finished on the podium in five of the six World Cup Super G races this season and has been in the top five in all six.
 - Gut-Behrami has finished in the top seven in her last 13 World Cup Super G races, dating back to January 2024.
 - Gut-Behrami has reached 98 World Cup podiums in her career and with two podiums in La Thuile, she would become the sixth woman to reach 100.
 - Gut-Behrami finished second in one of the only two other World Cup Super G races held in La Thuile, behind Tina Weirather (LIE) in February 2016.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has won 26 World Cup races in all disciplines and can equal Maria Höfl-Riesch (GER) in equal 15th on the women's all-time list.
 - Goggia has three podiums from six World Cup Super G races this season.
 - Goggia has never won a World Cup Super G on home snow in Italy. Her only Super G podium in Italy was a second place in Cortina d'Ampezzo in 2017.
- **Lauren Macuga (USA/Rossignol)** won the Super G in St. Anton in January but since then her World Cup Super G results have been 13th, 12th and 12th.
 - In 19 career Super G races, she has only four top-10 finishes and one podium.

- **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** has finished in the top seven in five of the six World Cup Super G races this season and the last four in a row.
- Vickhoff Lie is still searching for her first World Cup Super G win, having reached five podiums. Her only World Cup win came in a Downhill in Kvitfjell in March 2023.

- **Stephanie Venier (AUT/Head)** won the Super G world title in Saalbach last month but has won only one World Cup Super G race, in Crans Montana in February 2024.
- Venier has one World Cup Super G podium this season, second place in St. Anton.

- **Crystal Globe Race:** With three Super G races remaining entering Thursday, Gut-Behrami (465) leads Brignone (410) by 55 points, with Goggia (306) in third, 104 points behind her teammate.
- Gut-Behrami can win her sixth Super G globe, having claimed the season title in 2014, 2016, 2021, 2023 and 2024.
- Brignone can win her second Super G globe after 2022. Her current position of second is the same position she has finished in four of the last five years (2020, 2021, 2023 and 2024), three of those times behind Gut-Behrami.
