

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women’s Downhill Val di Fassa stat sheet

Previous DH race (Soldeu) stats

- **Corinne Suter’s (SUI/Head)** victory in **Soldeu** was her first World Cup win in more than three years, and marked **Switzerland’s** 100th women’s Downhill victory, making it the second nation after **Austria** (127) to reach 100.
- **Corinne Suter’s (SUI/Head)** win in **Soldeu** was her first victory in 43 races since a Super G win in **Lake Louise** in 2021/22. **Soldeu** was **Suter’s** first top-10 finish this season, and her sixth career World Cup win, surpassing **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)** (5) into 13th place among Swiss women.
- **Nina Ortlieb’s (AUT/Head)** 2nd in **Soldeu** was her first Downhill podium in more than three years, and her first podium in any discipline since a Super G 2nd in **Kvitfjell** in March 2023.
- **Sofia Goggia’s (ITA/Atomic)** 3rd in **Soldeu** was her 39th Downhill podium, surpassing **Stephan Eberharter (AUT)** (38) into seventh for all-time women’s and men’s DH podiums. **Goggia** has 68 podiums across all disciplines, which is equal-17th among women alongside **Marlies Schild (AUT)**.
- **Emma Aicher’s (GER/Head)** 4th in **Soldeu** took her to 306 points in the Downhill globe standings, which is less than one win behind injured **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** (400). **Aicher** is equal with **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** for the most top-10 finishes this season across all disciplines (15).
- **Laura Pirovano’s (ITA/Head)** 9th in **Soldeu** means that she and **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** are the only women to have finished in the top 10 in all six Downhill races so far this season. **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** and the injured **Vonn** are next best on five.

Val di Fassa 2 x DH stats

- **Val di Fassa** previously hosted two women’s Downhill races on consecutive days in 2020/21, with **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** winning both. **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** finished 3rd and 2nd, while **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** finished 4th and 3rd.
- There are five speed (3 x DH, 2 x SG) and four technical (2 x SL, 2 x GS) races remaining this season. In the race for the Overall Crystal Globe, **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** (1133 pts) leads **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** (963 pts), **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** (914 pts), then **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** (786 pts).
- **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** is the only woman this season to score points in all four disciplines, with 67% (610) of her points coming from speed races, making her the most realistic threat to **Shiffrin’s** overall lead.
- In the DH globe standings, **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** (306 pts) can surpass **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** (400 pts) with a single win in **Val di Fassa**. If **Aicher** finishes at least 5th in the first race in **Val di Fassa**, then any top-4 finish in the second will surpass **Vonn**. **Aicher** has finished in the top 6 in seven of her past eight DH races.

- **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** (256 pts) requires a win and a top-4 finish, or two second-place finishes, to overtake **Vonn** (400 pts) in **Val di Fassa**.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** (240 pts), **Laura Pirovano (ITA/Head)** (236 pts) and **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** (223 pts) would each require a win followed by a top-2 finish in order to overtake **Vonn** (400 pts) in **Val di Fassa**.
- A win for **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** will make her the fourth woman to reach 20 Downhill wins after **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** (45), **Annemarie Moser-Proell (AUT)** (36) and **Renate Goetschl (AUT)** (24).
- A podium for **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** will make her the fourth woman to reach 40 Downhill podiums, and seventh women's or men's skier to do so.
- A podium for **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** would be her 11th World Cup podium and see her move to outright 10th among German women and men. Currently **Aicher** is equal-10th alongside **Thomas Dressen**.
- **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** has eight DH podiums to her name but no wins.
- Of the 10 women to have made at least three top-10 Downhill finishes this season, **Laura Pirovano (ITA/Head)** is the only one not to have made a World Cup podium in any discipline in her career.
- **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** has 30 Top-10 Downhill finishes, needing one more to surpass **Picabo Street (USA)** into fourth on **USA's** all-time women's and men's DH list. Two podiums would see **Johnson** become the fifth **USA** woman to reach 10 DH podiums. **Johnson** is the reigning world and Olympic DH champion, but is yet to win a World Cup race in any discipline.
- **Cornelia Huetter's (AUT/Head)** next podium will see her become the fifth Austrian woman (and 15th from any nation) to achieve 20 Downhill podiums. **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** has 18 DH podiums and could join or overtake **Huetter** (19) in **Val di Fassa**.
- **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie's (NOR/Head)** next Downhill win will see her become the first Norwegian woman to win more than one DH race. **Lie** and **Ragnhild Mowinckel** are equal on one win each.
- **Austria** has 1249 women's World Cup podiums, needing one more to become the first nation to reach 1250 women's podiums. Only **Austria's** men have amassed more (1716).
- **Italy** has 119 women's Downhill podiums, needing one more to become the sixth nation to reach 120, after **Austria** (353), **Switzerland** (277), **USA** (163), **Germany** (127) and **France** (124).
- For Downhill starts **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** will make her 90th while **Jacqueline Wiles (USA/Rossignol)** her 75th in their first race in **Val di Fassa**.
- Across all disciplines, **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** and **Laura Pirovano (ITA/Head)** will make their 125th World Cup start in their first race in **Val di Fassa**, while **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** will make her 110th. If **Laura Gauche (FRA/Head)** starts both races in Val di Fassa, the second will be her 160th World Cup start.
