

FACTS & FIGURES – Women's giant slalom in Killington

- Mikaela Shiffrin (USA) can become the first Alpine skier to win 100 World Cup races. Twenty-two of her 99 wins have come in giant slalom.
- Shiffrin has reached 154 World Cup podiums. With a top-three finish on Saturday, she will equal Ingemar Stenmark's (SWE) Alpine skiing record of 155.
- Shiffrin has yet to win a World Cup giant slalom race in Killington. In six GS races in Vermont, she has three podiums (a second place and two third places).
- Shiffrin has won only one of her last eight World Cup giant slalom races dating back to the beginning of last season. The one win during that stretch came on 28 December, 2023, in Lienz, Austria.
- Shiffrin has won her last two World Cup starts (both slalom). If she wins on Saturday, it will be her ninth streak of three or more consecutive World Cup victories in all disciplines.
- Federica Brignone (ITA) can win her fourth consecutive World Cup giant slalom race. Brignone won the last two GS races of last season (Are and Saalbach) and the first one of this season (Soelden).
- Brignone can win her 14th career World Cup giant slalom race, equalling four other skiers in equal fifth place on the all-time women's list.
- Brignone has one win and one other podium (second place) from her six World Cup giant slalom races in Killington. The victory came in 2018.
- Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI) has won the last two World Cup giant slalom races in Killington, and can make it three in a row as she makes her season debut.
- Gut-Behrami has won nine World Cup giant slalom races. If she makes it 10 to go with 22 super-G and 13 downhill wins, she will become the first woman to complete the Alpine skiing 'triple-double' double-figure (10-plus) World Cup wins in three disciplines. Hermann Maier (AUT 24 SG, 15 DH, 14 GS) and Pirmin Zurbriggen (SUI 11 combined, 10 DH, 10 SG) are the only men to have done it.
- Gut-Behrami can win her 46th World Cup race in all disciplines to equal Renate Goetschl (AUT) in fifth place on the all-time women's list.
- Marta Bassino (ITA) is the only other active skier apart from Brignone and Gut-Behrami to have won a World Cup giant slalom race in Killington (2019). Bassino also finished second in Killington in 2022.
- Julia Scheib's (AUT) podium in Giant Slalom was the first for Austria in this
 discipline since Katharina Liensberger's podium in Lienz in 2019. Additionally,
 the only Austrian podium in Giant Slalom at Killington dates back to 2018 with
 Stephanie Brunner.
- Alice Robinson (NZL) has 11 career podiums, including 3 victories. With one
 more win, she could match Claudia Riegler's record for the most Alpine Skiing
 victories for New Zealand.
