

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men's Slalom

Kranjska Gora stat sheet

Milano Cortino Olympic Games stats

- **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** won the Milano Cortino Olympic gold in Slalom and claimed the bronze in Giant Slalom to become the first skier to feature on the Olympic podium in both technical disciplines at one Games since Torino 2006, when **Benjamin Raich (AUT)** became the Olympic champion in both events.
- **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** has won the first Olympic gold in Slalom for Switzerland since the very first Olympic Slalom at St. Moritz 1948, when **Edi Reinalter (SUI)** took the gold.
- **Fabio Gstrein (AUT/Atomic)** took the Olympic silver in the Milano Cortino Slalom. Gstrein has never managed to finish higher than 3rd place in the World Cup. His best result was 3rd place in 2024/25 Schladming and Sun Valley Slaloms, from 97 career World Cup starts.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** claimed his second Olympic Slalom bronze 12 years after his first one of the Sochi 2014 Games. No other man has managed to feature on the Olympic Slalom podium 12 years apart. **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** did the same in women's Slalom, winning in Sochi 2014 and Milano Cortina 2026.

Previous SL race (Schladming) stats

- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** won the most recent Slalom race in Schladming on 28 January. The runner-up was **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)**, with **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** finishing in 3rd place.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** took the lead in the Slalom World Cup standings after nine events with 452 points, just one point ahead of **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)**, who finished 4th in Schladming, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** is in third with 435 points.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** won his first race of the season and the 26th Slalom World Cup race. This win allowed Kristoffersen to join **Alexis Pinturault (FRA/Head)** in 10th place on the men's all-time World Cup winners list across all disciplines with 36 victories. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the men's field with 86 wins.
- A podium finish in Schladming allowed **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** to take the undisputed 3rd place on the all-time list with 101 career World Cup men's podiums. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the way with 155 podiums.

- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** has the most Slalom World Cup wins in the current season - two (on par with **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)**) and podiums - five. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** and **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** have four top-3 results both.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** and **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** helped Norway to become the first nation with a Slalom World Cup 1-2 of the season. They are the only nation with a 1-2 during the two most recent seasons: **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer) / Timon Haugan (Van Deer)** in Kranjska Gora 2024/25, **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer) / Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** in Val d'Isere 2024/25 and a podium sweep in Wengen 2024/25 with **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** in 1st, **Timon Haugan (Van Deer)** in 2nd and **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** in 3rd.
- A podium finish in Schladming allowed **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** to take the undisputed 10th place on the all-time list with 33 career Slalom World Cup men's podiums. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the way with 81 podiums.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom (1st, 2nd, four times 4th, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (three times 2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish during the 2025/26 season.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** and **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** are the only athletes to have finished inside the top 10 in eight out of nine Slalom World Cup races of the season.
- **Timon Haugan (Van Deer)** finished 6th in Schladming which allowed him the 7th place on his own on the all-time list with 32 career Slalom World Cup top-10 finishes among Norwegian athletes, men or women. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads the field with 95 top-10 finishes.
- In Schladming **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** recorded his third DNF of the season. He had claimed a spot inside the top six of the first six Slalom World Cup races he managed to finish since the start of the season, including two wins, recording one DNF in Val d'Isere. He's still in the contest for the Slalom Crystal Globe, but has earned only 18 points in his last three Slalom World Cup starts.

Kranjska Gora stats

- Eight athletes are still in the contest for the Slalom Crystal globe with two races to go: **Atle Lie McGrath's (NOR/Head)**, **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic; one point behind)**, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar; 17)**, **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer; 53)**, **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer; 79)**, **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head, 94)**; **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol; 140)** and **Eduard Hallberg (DIN/Fischer, 173)**.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** won the Slalom Globe four times in 2025/26, 2019/20, 2021/22 and 2024/26; **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** - once in 2022/23, representing Norway. There are two other active athletes who are out of the

Globe race this season, but topped the Slalom season standings in the past: **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic; 2020/21)** and **Manuel Feller (AUT/Atomic; 2023/24)**.

- The Slalom Crystal Globe will be decided in Kranjska Gora only in case of an **Atle Lie McGrath's (NOR/Head)** win, but the following conditions should also be met: **a. Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** fails to score points; and **b. any of the following skiers finish 15th or worse: Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar), Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer), Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer), Paco Rassat (FRA/Head).**
- Kranjska Gora first appeared on the World Cup Slalom calendar in March 1968. A total of 42 Slalom World Cup races have been held there to date.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** won the 2024/25 Kranjska Gora Slalom race, which was his last Giant Slalom win to date. The runner-up was **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)**, with **Manuel Feller (AUT/Atomic)** finishing in 3rd place.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** needs one more win in Kranjska Gora to become the athlete with the most wins here on par with **Alberto Tomba (ITA)** with three wins both.
- Another Kranjska Gora Slalom podium will allow **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** to take the lead in the list of athletes with the most top-3 finishes here. Currently he is level with **Thomas Stangassinger (AUT)** and **Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer)** at 6 each.
- Team Austria has the most wins in the Kranjska Gora World Cup Slaloms: nine. Italy has six victories and Norway has five.
- **Jure Kosir** was the last Slovenian athlete to win a World Cup Slalom race on the home slopes of Kranjska Gora back in the 1998/99 season.
- Slovenia hasn't won a World Cup Slalom race since **Mitja Kunc's** win in Yongpyong in February 2000. Kunz was also the last Slovenian on the World Cup Slalom podium, finishing 2nd in Wengen 2001/02.
- If **Manuel Feller (Atomic)** finishes in the top three he will move into fifth place outright on his own on the list for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Austrian athletes with 22. **Marcel Hirscher (Van Deer)**, now representing the Netherlands, is on top of the list with 65 podiums.
- If **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** wins in Kranjska Gora he will join **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** in the 5th place on the all-time for the most men's World Cup Slalom wins with 16. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the field with 40 Slalom victories.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** and **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** are looking to extend their streak of six consecutive Slalom World Cup top-10 finishes. This is the longest career streak for both athletes. **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** holds the

longest streak of 15 consecutive Slalom World Cup top-10 finishes, achieved during the 2014/15-2015/16 seasons.

- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/ Head)** needs one more podium finish to join **Finn Christian Jagge (NOR)** in the 3rd place for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Norwegian athletes with 17. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads this list with 61 top-3 results.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/ Head)** and **Timon Haugan (NOR/ Van Deer)** have five Slalom World Cup victories each. A win by any of them would see them join **Ole Christian Furuseth (NOR)** in 3rd place for the most Slalom World Cup wins among Norwegian athletes. **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/ Van Deer)** leads this list with 26 victories.
- **Loic Meillard (SUI/ Rossignol)** needs another top-3 finish to catch up with **Lise-Marie Morerod (SUI)** in 5th place on the list of the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Swiss athletes, men or women, with 15. Meillard is the only Swiss skier to have claimed a Slalom World Cup podium since the start of the 2024/25 season.
- **Loic Meillard (SUI/ Rossignol)** needs one more top-10 finish to join **Franz Heinzer (SUI)** and **Peter Mueller (SUI)** in the 6th place for the most Alpine World Cup top-10 results among male Swiss athletes with 112. **Didier Cuche** leads this list with 186 top-3 results.
- **Eduard Hallberg (FIN/ Fischer)** now has six Alpine World Cup top-10 results, he needs two more to draw level with **Henna Raita (FIN)** for the equal fifth place among Finnish skiers, men or women. Hallberg, who was named FIS Longines Rising Star in 2024/25, recorded only three top-15 finishes with a best result of 8th place before the current season.
- **Victor Muffat-Jeandet (FRA/Salomon)** has the opportunity in Kranjska Gora to stretch his streak of World Cup Slalom point-scoring races to 15, which will equal his career-best result. The streak that started in last season's Kitzbuehel is currently the longest in the field. The French skier has finished inside the top 10 three times during the streak, with a highest result of 6th place in Kranjska Gora in March 2025.
