

- The Coop FIS Cross-Country World Cup season has three events remaining, with the next stop in **Drammen, Norway**. Drammen has hosted individual sprint events 19 times since making its debut on the World Cup calendar in the 2002/03 season.
- Norwegian skiers have won 20 of the 22 Men's World Cup races held so far this season. In 15 of the 20 victories, another Norwegian finished second, and in 17 of those wins, there was another Norwegian on the podium.
- Norwegian skiers have won the last 11 individual World Cup races in a row, with **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** winning the last six.
- Norwegian skiers have recorded eight podium clean sweeps so far this season, after achieving 10 in the 2024/25 World Cup.
- Norway won all three Men's events of the first two World Cup stages this season, in Ruka, Finland, and Trondheim, Norway. The streak was broken in Davos, Switzerland, where **Lucas Chanavat (FRA)** won the Sprint. In Toblach, Italy, **Gus Schumacher (USA)** won the Tour de Ski-debuting 5km Heat Mass Start Free, preventing Norway from winning all six races of the Tour. These are the only two individual World Cup races won by a non-Norwegian athlete this season.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** won his 100th individual World Cup race - in his hometown of Trondheim, Norway - earlier this season. Klaebo became the first Men's athlete to reach this landmark, and second overall, joining compatriot **Marit Bjoergen (NOR)**, who claimed 114 World Cup wins before retiring in 2018.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** has won the Overall World Cup title five times, between 2017/18 and 2024/25. If he wins the 2025/26 Overall Crystal Globe, he will equal his countryman **Bjoern Daehlie (NOR)**, who holds the record of six Overall titles, won between 1991/92 and 1998/99. Klaebo is tied with **Gunde Svan (SWE)** on five titles.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** has held the record for most individual World Cup wins in a single season since 2022/23, when he topped the podium 19 times. Klaebo's 16 World Cup victories in the 2023/24 season is the second-highest number of World Cup wins in a single season. He has recorded 12 individual wins so far this season, including wins in the last six World Cup races.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** also holds the record for most individual podiums in a single season since 2022/23, when he finished in the top three 23 times in individual World Cup races. He has 14 individual podiums so far this season.

- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** won the Sprint Free in Lahti, Finland, last weekend, with **Lars Heggen (NOR)** in second place and **Jules Chappaz (FRA)** third. This was the seventh Sprint win of the season for Klaebo, out of nine Sprint races which have been held.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** also won the 10km Interval Start Classic in Lahti, Finland, last weekend, with **Martin Loewstroem Nyenget (NOR)** in second place and **Savelii Korostelev (FIS)** third. This was the first ever World Cup podium for Korostelev, who achieved his best result with a fourth place in the Skiathlon race the previous weekend in Falun, Sweden. His mother, Natalia Korosteleva, made her mark on Russian cross-country skiing by winning bronze in the team sprint at the Vancouver 2010 Winter Olympic Games. His uncle, Nikolai Morilov, was also a bronze medallist at the same edition of the Winter Games.
- In the 2023/24 edition of the World Cup held in Drammen, **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** won the Sprint Classic race, ahead of **Haavard Solaas Taugbol (NOR)** and **Even Northug (NOR)**, for a Norwegian podium clean sweep. It was his fourth World Cup victory in Drammen, which was not on the calendar for the 2024/25 season.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** dominated the Men's events of the Milano Cortina 2026 Winter Olympic Games, winning all six gold medals on offer. Klaebo has won a total of 11 gold medals at the Winter Olympic Games, more than any other athlete.
