

FACTS & FIGURES – Men's Super G in Bormio

- Marco Odermatt (SUI/ Stöckli) is double defending Super G World Cup champion.
- Odermatt claimed his first victory of the new Audi FIS World Cup season in the Super G at Beaver Creek, and was third in the Super G at Val Gardena.
- Odermatt leads the Super G standings after two of seven races this season.
- He won the Super G at Bormio last season (2023-24), and season before that (2022-23).
- In the previous two seasons Odermatt has won eight out of the 15 Super G races, including two victories last season and six in 2022/23.
- In that period Odermatt has never finished worse than fifth.
- Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/ Head) has been on the Super G podium three times in Bormio, without winning he was second in 2022-23, third in 2021-22, and second in 2020-21.
- He won the Downhill at Bormio in December 2022.
- Like Odermatt, Kriechmayr won twice last season, his eighth and ninth victories in the discipline.
- The 30-year-old finished second in the Super G rankings last season. It was his best finish since winning the Super G Crystal Globe in 2020-21.
- **Cyprien Sarrazin (FRA/ Rossignol)** is currently fourth in the standings after finishing second to Odermatt at Beaver Creek and DNF at Val Gardena.
- Sarrazin has won one career World Cup Super G, at Wengen in January 2024.
- Sarrazin has never finished a Super G at Bormio he recorded a DNF here for the past two seasons.
- Sarrazin has had more success in the Downhill. He won in Bormio in December 2023.
- Mattia Casse (ITA/ Rossignol) won his first ever Audi FIS World Cup race at the last Super G: he finished first in Val Gardena to record a debut victory aged 34.
- Casse has recorded three other career podiums, all third place finishes: in the Downhill at Val Gardena in December 2022, the Downhill in Wengen in January 2023, and the Super G in Cortina in January 2023.
- Casse is currently third in the Super G standings.
- Dominik Paris (ITA/ Nordica) won the Super G in Bormio in 2018-2019.
- Paris also has six Downhill wins in Bormio 2012, 2017, 2018, 2019 (twice) and 2021.
- Stefan Rogentin (SUI/ Fischer) finished fourth in the Super G standings last season, his best result in any discipline.
- Ryan Cochran-Siegle (USA/ Head) won Bormio 2020-21. It is his only career World Cup win to date.
- Jared Goldberg (USA/ Rossignol) recorded the first World Cup podium of his career at the last Super G: the 33-year-old finished second in Val Gardena.
