

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men’s Slalom Wengen stat sheet

Previous SL race (Adelboden) stats

- **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** won the most recent Slalom race in Adelboden on 11 January. The runner-up was **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)**, with **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** finishing in 3rd place.
- **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** has the lead in the Slalom World Cup after six events with 340 points, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** is in second with 314 points, **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** is third on 285.
- **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** became the third athlete to claim more than one World Cup win across all disciplines in the 2025/26 season after **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoekli; DH – 2, SG – 3, GS – 1)** and **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic; SG – 1, GS – 1)**.
- In Adelboden **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** recorded his second Slalom World Cup win and third podium finish of his career. All these achievements have come in the current season, during which he has also finished inside the top six of every Slalom World Cup race he managed to finish - recording one DNF in Val d'Isere. Before the start of this season Rassat had only one top-10 result in 34 Slalom World Cup starts – a 9th place in Wengen in January 2025.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** claimed his third Slalom World Cup podium finish of the season in Adelboden, which is the best result in the field, on par with **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** and **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)**.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom World Cup race he managed to finish since Gurgl in November 2024. He has claimed two wins and a total of eight podiums during this streak, but also had six DNFs along the way.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** claimed the second Slalom podium finish of the season in Adelboden, but the remaining four races this season have all seen him finish outside the top 10. Last season Kristoffersen finished inside the top 10 in 11 of the 12 Slalom World Cup races, while recording one DNF in Kitzbuehel.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** moved up to the second spot of the Overall World Cup standings after the Adelboden weekend. He has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom (1st, 4th, 4th, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (2nd, 2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish during the 2025/26 season.
- **Manuel Feller (AUT/Atomic)**, who has won a total of six Slalom World Cup races, ended a streak of nine Slalom races without a top-10 result in Adelboden by finishing 5th. This was Feller's 50th career Slalom top-10 finish.

- **Eduard Hallberg (Fischer)** claimed his fourth top-10 finish of the 2025/26 season in Adelboden. He now has five Alpine World Cup top-10 results, which is equal fourth-highest among Finnish skiers alongside **Andreas Romar**. Hallberg, who was named FIS Longines Rising Star in 2024/25, recorded only three top-15 finishes with a best result of 8th place before the current season.

Wengen stats

- Wengen first hosted a World Cup Slalom in January 1967. A total of 46 Slalom World Cup races have been held there to date.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** won the 2024/25 Wengen Slalom race. The runner-up was **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)**, with **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** finishing in 3rd place. This was the first Slalom World Cup podium sweep for Norway since Yongpyong in 1998/98, when **Ole Christian Furuseth** won ahead of **Finn Christian Jagge** in 2nd and **Tom Stiansen** in 3rd.
- Team Austria has the most wins in the Wengen World Cup Slaloms: 10. France has seven victories and Norway has six.
- The last Swiss athlete to win a Slalom race at home in Wengen was Joel Gaspoz in 1986/87. **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)** was the last Swiss skier to claim a Slalom podium here; he finished 2nd in 2022/23.
- **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** is the only skier to have finished inside the top 10 of five most recent Wengen Slalom races. **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** has five top-10 results in six previous Wengen Slaloms including two wins in 2018/19 and 2019/20 and an 11th place last season.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** needs one more podium in any discipline to draw level with **Marc Girardelli (LUX)**, who lies third on the men's all-time list with 100 career World Cup podiums. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the way with 155 podiums.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** has three wins in Wengen World Cup Slaloms. Another win will bring him level with **Ivica Kostelic (CRO)** at the top of the all-time list of career Slalom victories in Wengen.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** has finished inside the top 4 in 10 of the 12 Wengen World Cup Slalom races he has taken part in. He was 15th in his very first start here in 2013/14 and recorded a DNF in 2021/2022.
- If **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** finishes in the top 10, he will draw level with **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)**, who lies third on the all-time list with 93 career Slalom World Cup top-10 finishes. **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** leads the field with 111 top-10 finishes.
- If **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** finishes in the top 10, he'll move to outright 6th place in the all-time men's list with 187 career Alpine World Cup top-10 finishes,

one more than **Didier Cuche (SUI)** and one fewer than **Alexis Pinturault (FRA/Head)**. **Kjetil Andre Aamodt (NOR)** leads the field with 233 top-10 finishes.

- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** needs three more podium finishes to join **Finn Christian Jagge** in the 3rd place for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Norwegian athletes with 17. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads this list with 59 top-3 results.
- If **Manuel Feller (Atomic)** finishes in the top three he will join Tomas Sykora in 5th place on the list for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Austrian athletes with 21. **Marcel Hirscher (Van Deer)**, now representing the Netherlands, is on top of the list with 65 podiums.
- If **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** wins this weekend he will join **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** in the 5th place on the all-time for the most men's World Cup Slalom wins with 16. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the field with 40 Slalom victories.
- If **Clement Noel (Dynastar)** finishes in the top ten he will become the French athlete with the most top-10 Slalom World Cup finishes of all time with 53. Noel is currently joint-first on the list alongside **Alexis Pinturault (Head)** with 52.
