

FACTS & FIGURES – Women's slalom in Killington

- Depending on Saturday's result, **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA)** can become the first Alpine skier to win 100 World Cup races. Sixty-two of her 99 wins entering the weekend have come in slalom.
- Depending on Saturday's result, Shiffrin can equal or surpass Ingemar Stenmark's (SWE) record of 155 World Cup podiums. Shiffrin enters the weekend on 154.
- Shiffrin has won six of her seven World Cup slalom races in Killington. In the only race she didn't win, in 2022, she came fifth.
- Shiffrin can win her 63rd World Cup slalom race on Sunday, which would take her past Annemarie Moser-Proell's (AUT) World Cup victories total in all disciplines (62) in slalom alone. Lindsey Vonn (USA) is the only woman with more World Cup wins (82) in all disciplines than Shiffrin has in slalom.
- Shiffrin can win her third World Cup slalom race of the 2024/25 season. It would be the 11th different season in which she has won three or more slalom races.
- Wendy Holdener (SUI) and Anna Swenn Larsson (SWE) are the only skiers other than Shiffrin to win a World Cup slalom race in Killington. They tied for the victory in 2022, the first World Cup slalom victory for both skiers.
- Holdener has reached the podium in four of the seven Killington slaloms, including each of the last three seasons (two thirds and one victory).
- Swenn Larsson has one other slalom podium in Killington (third in 2019).
- In the absence of Petra Vlhova (SVK), **Katharina Liensberger (AUT)** is the only woman in the field other than Shiffrin with more than two career World Cup slalom victories. Liensberger has won three World Cup slaloms, the last coming in March 2022 in Are.
- Liensberger failed to finish the last two World Cup slalom races in Killington and has never made a World Cup slalom podium in the Vermont resort.
- Lena Duerr (GER, 3rd, 5th), Camille Rast (SUI, 5th, 3rd) and Shiffrin (1st, 1st) are the three skiers to have placed in the top five in both World Cup slaloms this season in Levi and Gurgl.
- Rast and fellow Gurgl podium finisher Lara Colturi (ALB) have never finished higher than 12th in any World Cup race in Killington entering the weekend.
- Lara Colturi's podium in Gurgl marked the first-ever podium in alpine skiing history for Albania.
