

Rules and Precisions for the Team Combined

Team Combined (TC)

- Is the result of a Downhill or Super-G run (speed event) and a single Slalom run held according to the technical regulations for Slalom and those for Downhill or Super-G. The Team Combined event consists of two runs. (see art. 621.3.3, 621.11.2, 627.7)
- Downhill and Super-G events of Team Combined must be held on courses specifically homologated for Downhill or Super-G respectively. The Slalom may be held on these courses.
- If possible both runs should be held on one day (exceptions can only be decided by the Jury)
- Participation
 - A maximum of 4 teams (per nation) with 2 competitors (per gender) can participate. Each competitor is allowed to start only in one event. The competitors that make up the team must be named before the draw. No changes can be done after the draw.
- Draw
 The starting order for the first event (DH / SG or SL in exceptional case) is determined by the FIS points of the competitor entered in the event.
- Starting numbers given to the team for the 1st run remain the same for the 2nd run.
- Starting order 2nd run
 The starting order for the 2nd run is determined by the result list of the 1st run except
 for the first 30 places who will start in reverse order. A competitor will not be permitted
 to start the 2nd run if his teammate was DSQ, DNS, NPS or DNF in the first run.
- The Combined results are calculated by adding the race times of the teammates of the single events.

Precisions for the 2026 Narvik (NOR) FIS Alpine Junior World Ski Championships

- Teams must be nominated before the SG/TC Team Captain's Meeting.
- A specific start list will be published with those competitors entered for the Team Combined.
- The Medal Super G event will be used as the result of the first run for the Team Combined including only those competitors entered for the Team Combined.
- No FIS points will be distributed for the Team Combined.
- Medals will be awarded only to the first 3 classified teams. No U18 prizes will be awarded.
- All first 10 classified teams will get Marc Hodler points, whereby a maximum of two teams per nation may score points in the event.
