

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men's Slalom

Madonna di Campiglio stat sheet

- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** won the most recent Audi FIS World Cup Slalom race in Alta Badia. The runner-up was **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)**, with **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** finishing in 3rd place.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** has now won once, finished 3rd once (Gurgl Slalom) and recorded two second-run DNFs (Levi and Val d'Isere) this season. In both Levi and Val d'Isere he was inside the top 6 after the 1st run.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** now has four career World Cup Slalom wins and nine other podium finishes to place him fourth on the all-time list of Norwegian World Cup Slalom podium finishes, just ahead of legend **Kjetil Andre Aamod**. Compatriot **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads the list with 58 podiums.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** retains the lead in the Slalom World Cup Crystal Globe standings with 245 points after four events, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** is in 2nd with 182 points, **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** is 3rd on 180.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** has finished in the top five in all four Slalom races this season - no other athlete has finished inside the top 10 in all four races this season.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** has now claimed top-5 finishes in eight consecutive Slalom World Cup races, which is the longest current streak in the discipline and the longest of Haugan's career. This streak started with his win in Schladming in January 2025.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** needs one more win to draw level with **Ole Kristian Furuseth (NOR)**, who lies third on the all-time list of victorious Norwegian male Slalom skiers with six career wins. Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer) leads this list with 25 wins.
- **Clement Noel's (FRA/Dynastar)** 2nd place in Alta Badia was his 31st podium World Cup podium finish, enough to take him above compatriot **Jean-Noel Augert** and into second place on his own in the all-time list of French World Cup podium finishes (across all disciplines). **Alexis Pinturault (FRA/Head)** leads the list with 77 podium finishes.
- **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** is already the most successful French World Cup Slalom skier, with 31 podium finishes to his name, including 14 wins. He needs just one more podium finish to make it into the top 10 of the list of podium finishes achieved by all skiers through history. Italian **Gustavo Thoeni (ITA)** is currently one ahead of Noel. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the global list with 81 Slalom podiums.

- **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** claimed his 13th career Slalom World Cup podium finish in Alta Badia. He's chasing **Daniel Yule (SUI/Atomic)** who tops the list of most successful Swiss Slalom skiers, with 17 top-3 results.
- **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** claimed his second consecutive Slalom World Cup podium finish in Alta Badia, after failing to make it to the top 10 in the first two races of the season. Only two other athletes have two top-3 finishes in the 2025/26 season so far: **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** and **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)**.
- **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** is having the best season of his career so far, having risen to 3rd in the rankings. He has finished inside the top six of every Slalom World Cup race he has finished, recording one DNF (in Val d'Isere). Before the start of this season Rassat had only one top-10 result in 34 Slalom World Cup starts - a 9th place in Wengen in January 2025.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom (1st, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish.
- Madonna di Campiglio first hosted a World Cup Slalom in February 1967, during the very first Alpine World Cup season. A total of 42 Slalom World Cup races have been held in the resort since.
- With five wins, **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** is the most successful World Cup Slalom skier in Madonna di Campiglio so far. **Daniel Yule (SUI/Atomic)** and **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** - both three-time winners in Madonna di Campiglio - have the opportunity to jump ahead of **Alberto Tomba (ITA)** and into second place on their own behind Stenmark. Yule won in 2018/19, 2019/20 and 2022/23; Kristoffersen in 2015/16, 2016/17 and 2020/21.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** needs one more top-10 finish to catch **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** and **Bojan KRIZAJ (SLO)** for the most top-10 results in Madonna di Campiglio at 10 each. Kristoffersen has the most Madonna di Campiglio podiums among active athletes; six.
- Italian skiers have the most World Cup Slalom wins in the Madonna di Campiglio with nine so far. Swedish and Norwegian skiers have recorded five victories each.
- **Albert Popov (BUL/Head)** won the 2024/25 World Cup Slalom race in Madonna di Campiglio. **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** was 2nd and **Samuel Kolega (CRO/Rossignol)** finished 3rd.
- This was the first and to date only career win for **Albert Popov (BUL/Head)**, and only the second ever for Bulgaria in Alpine skiing after Petar Popangelov won a Slalom on exactly the same day 45 years earlier, on 8 January 1980 in Lenggries, Germany.

- The last Italian skier to win a World Cup Slalom race on home snow was **Giorgio Rocca** in 2005/06 in Madonna di Campiglio. **Alex Vinatzer (Atomic)** was the last Italian on the podium Madonna di Campiglio, finishing 3rd in 2020/21.
- Italian skiers haven't won a men's World Cup Slalom event for 91 consecutive races. It's Italy's all-time longest winless streak in history. **Manfred Moelgg** was the last Italian to win a World Cup Slalom race in Zagreb in January 2017.
