

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women's Slalom Semmering stat sheet

Previous SL race (Courchevel) stats

- **Mikaela Shiffrin's (USA/Atomic)** four Slalom wins this season marked the following: the **USA's 400th** women's and men's World Cup win in any event (16 Dec in **Courchevel**); the **USA's 100th** women's SL win (30 Nov in **Copper Mountain, CO**) and 200th women's SL podium (Nov 15 in **Levi**); and **Shiffrin** won the race in which **Paula Moltzan (USA/Rossignol)** also finished fifth to make the **USA's 800th** women's and men's SL top 10 finish (23 Nov in **Gurgl**).
- **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** won four Slalom races last season, a mark she has already met in the first four SL races this season. **Shiffrin** finished 1.55s ahead of **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** in **Courchevel**, with **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** in third. All four of **Shiffrin's** SL wins this season were won by 1.23s or more. Of the 50 biggest winning margins for women's SL, **Shiffrin** now owns more than a third (17).
- **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** won the last Slalom race of 2024/25 in **Sun Valley**, meaning she is on a five-race SL winning streak across both seasons. The last women's skier to win five consecutive SL races was **Petra Vlhova (SVK/Rossignol)** across the 2019/20 and 2020/21 seasons. The last skier to win five consecutive SL races in the same season was **Shiffrin** in the opening five SL races of 2018/19.
- **Switzerland** made its 6000th women's and men's Top 10 finish in all events in **Courchevel**, thanks to the results of **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** (second) and **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)** (seventh).
- **Camille Rast's (SUI/Head)** second in **Courchevel** was her fifth Slalom podium in 53 starts. **Rast's** first SL podium this season, a third in **Gurgl**, was **Switzerland's 200th** women's SL podium. **Rast** has now made five podiums in her last 13 SL races.
- **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)** made her 130th Slalom start in **Courchevel**, the sixth women's skier to reach the mark. **Holdener** has 38 SL podiums, sixth-highest for women, behind **Erika Hess (SUI)** (42).
- **Emma Aicher's (GER/Head)** third in **Courchevel** was her second Slalom podium after finishing third in the season opener in **Levi**. **Aicher** is the fifth German to have made a women's World Cup podium in Downhill, Super G and Slalom
- **Lara Colturi's (ALB/Blizzard)** three-race Slalom podium streak came to an end in **Courchevel** with a DNF in the first run. **Colturi** is still looking for her and **Albania's** first World Cup win.
- **Lara Della Mea (ITA/Fischer)** finished eighth in **Courchevel**, her best SL result in 58 starts.

Semmering

- **Semmering** has hosted 17 World Cup Slalom races, all women's. The first in 1995/96 was won by **Pernilla Wiberg (SWE)**. **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** is the only skier to have won three SL races in **Semmering**, while three women have each won two - **Wiberg**, **Marlies Schild (AUT)** and **Janica Kostelic (CRO)**. **Zrinka Ljusic (CRO/Atomic)** and **Michelle Gisin (SUI/Salomon)** are the only other *active* skiers besides **Shiffrin** to have won a SL race in **Semmering**.
- **Zrinka Ljusic (CRO/Atomic)** won the most recent SL race in **Semmering** (2024/25) by 1.75s ahead of **Lena Duerr (GER/Head)**, with **Katharina Liensberger (AUT/Rossignol)** in third. This was the 20th-biggest winning margin of any women's SL race in history and the biggest in **Semmering** to date.

- **Katharina Liensberger's (AUT)** third in 2024/25 is the most recent Austrian Slalom podium in **Semmering**. The last time an Austrian won a SL race in **Semmering** was **Marlies Schild (AUT)** in 2010/11.
- **Katharina Truppe (AUT/Voelkl)** finished fourth in **Courchevel**. **Truppe** is the most recent Austrian to win a Slalom race, with a victory in **Are** in the second-last SL race of last season.
- **Austria** is on 999 women's SL top 10 finishes. No nation has reached 1000 before.
- **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** also has the most podiums in **Semmering** (4) with **Pernilla Wiberg (SWE)**, **Marlies Schild (AUT)** and **Janica Kostelic (CRO)** all on three. **Shiffrin** did not contest the 2024/25 race in **Semmering**, but made the four previous SL podiums there.
- Three active skiers have made two podiums in **Semmering** - **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)** finished third in 2016/17 and 2018/19, **Katharina Liensberger (AUT/Rossignol)** finished second in 2020/21 and third in 2024/25, while **Lena Duerr (GER/Head)** finished third in 2022/23 and second in 2024/25. **Paula Moltzan (USA/Rossignol)** has one podium in **Semmering**, a second in 2022/23.
- **USA** has the most SL wins in **Semmering** with four. In addition to **Mikaela Shiffrin's (USA/Atomic)** three wins, **Kristina Koznick (USA)** won a SL in 1998/99. **Sweden**, **Croatia** and **Austria** each have three wins, while **Italy**, **Switzerland**, **Slovakia** and **Germany** all have one.
- If **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** wins, it will be her sixth consecutive Slalom win since 2024/25. The last women's skier to win six consecutive SL races was **Shiffrin** across 2018/19 and 2019/20.
- **Katharina Liensberger (AUT)** and **Lena Duerr (GER/Head)** are both on 17 Slalom podiums alongside **Annemarie Moser-Proell (AUT)**, **Tina Maze (SLO)** and **Sarka Strachova (CZE)**, which is 21st best for women's SL podiums, behind **Nicole Hosp (AUT)** who rounds out the Top 20 outright on 19.
- **Germany** is on 29 women's and men's SL wins. A win for **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** or **Lena Duerr (GER/Head)** will see **Germany** become the 10th nation to achieve 30 SL wins.
- If **Emma Aicher's (GER/Head)** wins, she will become the third German woman (along with **Hilde Gerg** and **Maria Hoefl-Riesch**) to have won World Cup races in DH, SG and SL.
- **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** and **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)** each have two Slalom World Cup wins, which is equal-fifth for Swiss women (alongside **Sonja Nef** and **Karin Roten Meier**). A win for **Rast** or **Holdener** would see that skier move to outright fifth. If **Holdener** wins, she will become the oldest athlete representing **Switzerland** to win a women's World Cup SL race at age 32 (**Vreni Schneider** holds the current record of age 30).
- A victory for **Switzerland** would see the nation equal **Sweden** on 108 women's and men's SL wins, which is fourth-highest behind **Austria** (222), **France** (133) and **USA** (126).
- **Lena Duerr (GER/Head)** has the most women's World Cup Slalom starts on 142, and is the only skier besides **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** (122 SL starts) to have made at least four SL podiums in each of the past four seasons. **Shiffrin** has already achieved four SL podiums again this season, while **Duerr** has one (second in **Copper Mountain, CO**). **Duerr** only has one SL win among her 18 SL podiums, achieved in **Spindleruv Mlyn** in 2022/23 when she won by .06s ahead of **Shiffrin**.

- **Anna Swenn Larsson (SWE/Head)**, who finished sixth in **Courchevel**, is on 14 Slalom World Cup podiums, needing one more to become the 29th woman to make 15 SL podiums.
