

Ski Cross World Cup 2025/26 - Women's Innichen stat sheet

- No Italian of any gender has won a World Cup race on the slopes of Innichen. The only Italian woman to win a World Cup race anywhere in Italy is **Jole Galli**, who triumphed in Val di Fassa last season.
- **Jole Galli (ITA)** came second in the most recent race in Innichen last season. It was the first time an Italian woman had been on the podium in 27 races on the slope.
- Victory in both races in Innichen would make it five consecutive World Cup wins for Sandra Naeslund (SWE). The only athlete of any gender who has previously achieved that feat is Naeslund herself, who registered a 17-race winning streak across the 2022 and 2023 season.
- Sandra Naeslund (SWE) has won 42 World Cup races, the most of any woman in ski cross history.
- No athlete of any gender has more wins (7) or podium placings (12) at Innichen than **Sandra Naeslund (SWE)**.
- Since the start of the 2022 season **Sandra Naeslund (SWE)** has won 25 of the 33 World Cup races (76%) she has started.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, in which she won her first Crystal Globe, Sandra Naeslund (SWE) has finished on the podium in 55 of 69 races she has started (80%).
- Sandra Naeslund (SWE) won both races of the opening event in Val Thorens. In total she has registered double victories on the same weekend 11 times across six venues, including twice in Innichen in 2022 and 2023.
- Fanny Smith (SUI) has won four races in Innichen, making her tied in second place overall for women in Innichen (with Germany's Heidi Zacher). Only Sandra Naeslund has done better, with seven victories.
- If she starts both races in Innichen, **Marielle Thompson (CAN)** will have started more World Cup races in Innichen than at any other single venue.
- Marielle Thompson (CAN) has not won any of the 23 races she has started on the slopes of Innichen. The most appearances she has made at another single venue without winning is seven at Reiteralm. Thompson has seven podiums in Innichen.
- Half of **Daniela Maier's (GER)** four World Cup career victories came on the slopes of Innichen last year, as she won both races over the weekend.
- **Katrin Ofner's (AUT)** victory in the Small Final at Arosa was her best finish in a World Cup race since she finished fifth in both races at the Craigleith event in 2023.
