

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women’s 2 x Super G Soldeu stat sheet

Milano Cortina 2026 Olympic Winter Games SG stats

- **Federica Brignone’s (ITA/Rossignol)** Super G victory at Milano Cortina 2026 was the first Olympic gold medal won by an Italian in three editions of the Games on home snow (1956, 2006, 2026) over 26 races. **Brignone** is the oldest Olympic SG champion at age 35 years and 213 days, surpassing the previous record of 34 years and 169 days by **Kjetil Andre Aamodt (NOR)** at Torino 2006.
- **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** is the third Italian woman to win Olympic Super G gold, after **Daniela Ceccarelli** at Salt Lake City 2002 and **Deborah Compagnoni** at Albertville 1992. After winning Giant Slalom gold at Milano Cortina 2026, **Brignone** now has five Olympic medals, surpassing **Compagnoni’s** four to equal the most for Italian Alpine skiers alongside **Alberto Tomba**.
- **Romane Miradoli’s (FRA/Dynastar)** Super G silver at Milano Cortina 2026 is France's second Olympic women’s SG medal, after **Carole Merle's** silver at Albertville 1992, and France's first medal in any women’s Alpine skiing discipline since **Laure Pequegnot's** Slalom silver at Salt Lake City 2002. At age 31 years and 339 days, **Miradoli** is the oldest French woman to win an Olympic Alpine skiing medal.
- **Cornelia Huetter’s (AUT/Head)** Super G bronze at Milano Cortina 2026 was the sixth consecutive Olympic Games in which **Austria** has won an women’s SG medal, the longest active women's SG streak for any nation. At age 33 years and 106 days, **Huetter** is the oldest Austrian to win a women’s or men’s Olympic SG medal, surpassing the previous record of 32 years and 332 days set by **Michaela Dorfmeister (AUT)** when she won SG gold at Torino 2006.

Soldeu 2 x SG stats

- **Soldeu** has hosted three women’s World Cup Super G races, and **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** is the only skier to be on the podium in all three. **Brignone** won the first of those in 2015/16 for her first ever SG win.
- **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** finished third in **Soldeu** in 2018/19, and second in the most recent women’s SG there in 2022/23 behind **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)**. **Gut-Behrami** and **Brignone** are the only active skiers to have made a SG podium in **Soldeu**.
- After four of eight Super G races this season, no skier or nation has won more than once – **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)**, **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)**, **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** and **Malorie Blanc (SUI/Atomic)** are the four SG winners so far. **Goggia** is the only skier to have finished in the Top 6 in all four SG races, while **Robinson** and the now-injured **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** have managed three Top 6 finishes. **Goggia** also has the most SG podiums so far this season (3), followed by **Robinson** and **Vonn** on two each.
- **Malorie Blanc’s (SUI/Atomic)** Super G win in **Crans Montana** in February was her first World Cup win and came at age 22 years and 25 days, making her the youngest Swiss woman to win a World Cup SG race since **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** won in **Zauchensee** in 2010/11 at age 19.
- If **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** wins at least one Super G race in **Soldeu**, she will move to outright eighth for all-time women’s and men’s Super G wins with 14 - **Brignone** is currently equal-eighth (13) alongside **Kjetil Jansrud (NOR)**. For SG podiums among women only, **Brignone** is

currently equal fourth (27) alongside **Katja Seizinger (GER)** and will move to outright fourth with at least one SG podium in **Soldeu**.

- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has won eight World Cup Super G races, equal eighth among women alongside **Hilde Gerg (GER)**. With one win in Soldeu, Goggia would move to outright eighth; with two wins, she would join **Michaela Dorfmeister (AUT)** in equal seventh with 10 SG wins. If **Goggia** makes at least one SG podium in **Soldeu**, she will move to 23 SG podiums, which would put her in equal-seventh for women alongside **Gerg**, while two podiums will see her move into outright seventh (24).
- If **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastar)** wins one SG race in **Soldeu**, she will become the fourth French woman and sixth French women's or men's skier to win more than one World Cup SG race.
- **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)**, **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)**, **Nina Ortlieb (AUT/Head)** and **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** have two SG wins each, vying to become the 31st woman to reach three. A win for **Aicher** will see her move from equal-fifth for SG wins among German women's and men's skiers (2) to equal-fourth alongside **Maria Hoefl-Riesch** (3).
- If **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** wins once in **Soldeu** she will move from equal-13th for women's SG victories (5) - alongside **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** - to equal-12th alongside **Marina Kiehl (GER)** (6). A podium for **Huetter** will make her the 18th woman to reach 15 SG podiums.
- If **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** wins once in **Soldeu**, she will become the 44th woman to win more than one World Cup SG race. Her first Super G win came earlier this season in **St. Moritz**.
- For women's and men's Super G wins, several nations could reach significant milestones with one or more wins in **Soldeu**. **Italy** is on 53, needing two wins to equal **Norway** (55) in third place behind **Austria** (153) and **Switzerland** (102). Behind **Italy** sits **USA** on 48 wins, needing two more to become the fifth nation to reach 50. **Germany** then follows on 39 wins, needing one more to become the sixth nation to reach 40.
- In women's races only, **Italy** is on 99 World Cup Super G podiums, needing one more to become the fourth nation to reach 100 after **Austria** (237), **Switzerland** (124) and **Germany** (102).
- For Super G starts, **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** has 88 and could reach 90 if she takes part in both SG races in **Soldeu**. **Laura Gauche (FRA/Head)** has 73 and could reach 75, **Nicole Delago (ITA/Atomic)** has 58 and could reach 60, **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** has 48 and could reach 50, and **Nadine Fest (AUT/Head)** has 49 and will reach 50 with a single SG start in **Soldeu**.
- **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)** has 96 Super G starts, which is fifth-highest among women behind **Alexandra Meissnitzer (AUT)** on 97, meaning **Curtoni** can move into outright fourth - behind **Renate Goetschl (AUT)** on 106 – if she starts both SG races in **Soldeu**.
- **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** and **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** are the only two skiers to have competed in all of the last 45 women's Super G races dating back to 2020/21.
