

FACTS & FIGURES – Men's super-G in Beaver Creek

- Marco Odermatt (SUI) is the double defending super-G World Cup champion.
- In the last two seasons Odermatt has won eight out of the 15 super-G races, including two victories last season and six in 2022/23.
- In that period Odermatt never finished worse than fifth.
- His record in Beaver Creek is almost as good, with Odermatt winning in 2019 and 2021 and coming second in 2021 (second of a double-header) and 2022.
- **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT)** is the only other man in the field to have won a super-G in Beaver Creek, the Austrian triumphing back in 2017.
- Like Odermatt, Kriechmayr won twice last season, his eighth and ninth victories in the discipline.
- The 30-year-old ended the season second in the standings, his best result since claiming the Globe back in 2020/21.
- Alexis Pinturault (FRA) was third the last time the men raced super-G in Beaver Creek his second time on the podium there, having also ended third in 2014.
- **Stefan Rogentin (SUI)** led a Swiss 1-2-3 in the last World Cup super-G in Saalbach (AUT) in March.
- That helped the 30-year-old finish fourth in the standings, his best result in any discipline.
- Austria's Raphael Hasser was another to record his best ever Globe finish. Two second places, plus a further four top-15 efforts helped the 27-year-old end up third.
- **Cyprien Sarrazin (FRA)** followed up his miracle downhill season with a strong super-G showing. The Frenchman victorious down Wengen's Lauberhorn.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA)** is another who can bank on strong recent form and good memories in Beaver Creek.
- The Italian finished inside the top-10 four times last season with a best of third in Kvitfjell (NOR).
- That is a result he equalled in Beaver Creek back in 2018.
