

Facts & Figures Cogne

- It is the ninth time that a Coop FIS Cross-Country World Cup stage is held in Cogne. The previous two times were in 2019 and 2007.
- Jasmi Joensuu (FIN), runner-up on 513 points in the women's sprint standings, has a good chance to take back the first place as the new leader Jonna Sundling (SWE), on 532 points, is not competing.
- Women's distance standings No.1, Astrid Oeyre Slind, 36, has had 10 of her career's 12 World Cup podiums, including all four victories, this season.
- Swedish 22-year-old Edvin Anger, who has been top-two in the past two World Cup sprints, looks to close the gap to leader Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR) in the sprint standings. Anger has 459 sprint points and Klaebo, who is not competing in Cogne, has 587.
- The last time Sweden's women did not win a Team Sprint was in Ulricehamn, Sweden, in February 2021, when Maja Dahlqvist (SWE) and Linn Svahn (SWE) finished in second place after Slovenia.
