

Audi FIS Alpine Skiing World Cup 2025/26

Men's Downhill Kvitfjell Stat Sheet

Previous Race (Courchevel) and General Downhill Stats

- **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** won the eighth race of the Audi FIS World Cup Downhill season in Courchevel (FRA) on 13 March. It was his first World Cup Downhill win of the season. **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** finished 2nd for his third Downhill and fifth overall podium of his career, all achieved during the current season. **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** was 3rd, which allowed him to clinch both the Downhill and the Overall Crystal Globes.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** tops the 2025/26 World Cup Downhill standings after eight events with 670 points. **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** is 2nd with 435 and **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** is in 3rd place with 354.
- **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** became the fourth athlete to claim a Downhill World Cup win this season. **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** also has one win, **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** has two and **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** has four.
- **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** became the third athlete to claim World Cup wins in both speed disciplines this season after **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol; 1 DH, 1 SG)** and **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli, 4 DH, 2 SG)**.
- The win in Courchevel allowed **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** to end Austria's all-time longest streak of 23 consecutive Downhill World Cup races without a win. Kriechmayr had been the last Austrian to win a Downhill race before the streak began, triumphing in Soldeu in March 2023.
- **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** became the oldest athlete to claim a win in any discipline this season at 34 years, 5 months and 12 days.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** and **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** are the only two athletes who have managed to claim more than one Downhill World Cup win during the 2024/25 and 2025/26 seasons. Odermatt has six, von Allmen four.
- **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** has a total of three career Downhill World Cup podiums, all of which he has claimed since the start of the 2026 calendar year. He has four podiums in six Downhill starts in 2026, including winning silver at the 2026 Milano Cortina Olympic Winter Games.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** has finished inside the top 10 in each of his past 19 World Cup races across all disciplines, and the top 5 in each of his last 11 World Cup races. He has claimed seven wins and 12 podiums during that streak.

Kvitfjell Downhill Stats

- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** can guarantee second place in the season-long Downhill standings by finishing inside the top 13 will guarantee him that. Von Allmen was the runner-up in the Downhill Globe race last season.
- **Marco Odermatt's (SUI/Stöckli)** next victory will lift him into outright third place on the men's all-time World Cup winners list across all disciplines. Odermatt now has 54 World Cup wins, on par with **Hermann Maier (AUT)**. He trails only **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE, 86)** and **Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer, 67)**.
- **Marco Odermatt's (SUI/Stöckli)** next victory will see him join **Vreni Schneider (SUI)** as the most successful Swiss World Cup racer with 55 wins, and join Schneider in 6th place on the all-time World Cup winners list across all disciplines, men or women. Even with his current tally of 54 World Cup wins, Odermatt has fewer than half the victories of the all-time leader **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic, 109)**.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** and **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** enter the World Cup finals tied for 3rd on the men's all-time list with 102 career Alpine World Cup podiums. Odermatt will make three starts in Norway, while Kristoffersen will only make two. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the list with 155 career top-3 finishes.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** has claimed four Downhill World Cup wins this season, a career best result for him. Another win will allow him to become the second Swiss skier to achieve five Downhill wins in one season since **Pirmin Zurbriggen** in 1986/87.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** has claimed a podium spot in seven out of eight Downhill races this season. The only non-podium race for him was Crans Montana, where he finished 4th. If Odermatt manages another podium finish in the remaining race, he'll equal **Franz Klammer's (AUT)** record of eight podiums in nine races in 1974/75. All eight podiums were wins for Klammer, though. **Jean Claude Killy (FRA)** achieved a perfect season in 1966/67 by winning every race, but there were only five of them that year.
- A win in Kvitfjell for **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** would see the Italian claim outright 2nd place on the all-time men's Downhill World Cup winners list. Currently Paris – whose most recent win came in Kvitfjell in March 2025 – sits alongside **Peter Müller (SUI)** with 19 World Cup victories. **Franz Klammer (AUT)** is out in front with 25 wins.
- If **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** claims a podium finish in Kvitfjell he'll occupy outright 6th place on the all-time men's Downhill World Cup top-3 finishes list, with 35 podiums. Currently he is number with **Franz Heinzer (SUI)**. **Beat Feuz (SUI)** tops this list with 47.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** is chasing his 12th consecutive World Cup Downhill top-10 finish. If Paris manages to continue his streak, which started in Crans Montana in February 2025, it'll become the longest one in his career.

- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** has the chance to claim his 12th consecutive top-five finish in a World Cup Downhill race, which will be the all-time second best result. This streak dates back to the 2024/25 race in Crans Montana in February 2025. **Franz Klammer (AUT)** holds the longest streak with 16.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** is also going for his 24th consecutive World Cup Downhill top-10 finish. This is already on the second-longest all-time streak, behind **Beat Feuz's (SUI)** record of 36.
- **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** has the opportunity to claim a podium place in the season-long standings of both speed disciplines. Franzoni has one Downhill win and a total of three podiums this season. Franzoni started the season having never recorded a World Cup podium.
- If a Swiss athlete steps on to the podium in Kvitfjell, this will be team Switzerland's 23rd consecutive Downhill World Cup podium - the longest streak for the team and second all-time longest. The longest ever streak of 33 consecutive Downhill World Cup podiums belongs to team Austria (2002/03-2005/06).
- Kvitfjell first appeared on the World Cup Downhill calendar in March 1993. A total of 40 Downhill World Cup races have been held there to date.
- Kvitfjell held a Downhill doubleheader last season. **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** won the first race, while **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** took the second one. **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** was 2nd and **Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer)** 3rd in both races.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** has the most wins in Kvitfjell Downhill World Cup races - four (2015/16, 2018/19, 2021/22 and 2024/25). No other athlete managed to win there more than twice.
- Team Austria has the most wins in Kvitfjell Downhill World Cup races - 14. Switzerland is 2nd with 6 wins, Italy has five. Norwegian skiers have won four times on home snow in Kvitfjell. **Kjetil Jansrud** was the last Norwegian to win here in 2016/17.
- If a Swiss athlete steps onto the podium, this will be Switzerland's 10th consecutive Downhill World Cup podium in Kvitfjell dating back to the 2016/17 season.
