

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men's Slalom Kitzbuehel stat sheet

Previous SL race (Wengen) stats

- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** won the most recent Slalom race in Wengen on 18 January. The runner-up was **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)**, with **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** finishing in 3rd place.
- As a result of his victory, **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** claimed the lead in the Slalom World Cup after seven events with 372 points. **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** is in second with 351 points, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** is third on 343.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** claimed his second Slalom World Cup win of the season in Wengen, with **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** the only other skier to achieve that feat this season. It was McGrath's fourth Slalom World Cup podium finish of the season, which is more than any other male athlete has achieved.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom World Cup race he managed to finish since Gurgl in November 2024. He has claimed three wins and a total of nine podiums during this streak, but also had six DNFs along the way.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** is now in second place in both the Slalom and the Overall World Cup standings after the Wengen weekend. He has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom (1st, 2nd, 4th, 4th, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (2nd, 2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish during the 2025/26 season.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** and **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** are the only athletes to have finished inside the top 10 in six out of seven Slalom World Cup races of the season.
- The top-10 finish in Wengen allowed **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** to draw level with **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)** in third place on the all-time list with 93 career Slalom World Cup top-10 finishes, men or women. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE, 99)** is top of the men's section while **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** leads the overall field with 111 top-10 finishes.
- **Clement Noel (Dynastar)** finished in the top ten in Wengen to become the French male athlete with the most top-10 Slalom World Cup finishes of all time with 53. He is in 2nd place in the list of French men and women combined, with **Perrin Pelen** leading the way with 61 career top-10 results.
- **Matthias Iten (SUI/Head)** claimed his career highest Slalom World Cup result of 6th place in Wengen. He had only managed to score points in three World Cup races prior to that, including one other top-10 result in Val d'Isere in December 2025.

Kitzbuehel stats

- Kitzbuehel first hosted a World Cup Slalom during the very first Alpine World Cup season in January 1967. A total of 58 Slalom World Cup races have been held there to date.
- **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** has the best record in the Kitzbuehel Slalom, having claimed the most wins (five) and the most podiums (eight). **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** and **Jean-Noel Augert (FRA)** each won three Kitzbuehel Slaloms. No other skier has managed to win more than twice.
- Team Austria has the most wins in the Kitzbuehel Slalom – 14. France has 12 wins and Sweden eight.
- **Marcel Hirscher (Van Deer)** was the last Austrian athlete to win a World Cup Slalom race on the home slopes of Kitzbuehel back in the 2026/17 season. Hirscher, two-time Olympic Alpine skiing champion currently representing the Netherlands, confirmed recently that he will not compete in the World Cup nor in Milano-Cortina Olympics, as he continues his recovery from a knee injury.
- If Austrian skiers fail to win in Kitzbuehel, the nation will repeat its third all-time longest streak of 22 World Cup Slalom races without a win. The longest one lasted for 43 races during the 1977/78–1982/83 seasons.
- **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** won the most recent 2024/25 Kitzbuehel Slalom race. The runner-up was **Alex Vinatzer (ITA/Atomic)**, with **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** finishing in 3rd place.
- If **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** wins this weekend he will become the first skier since **Jens Byggmark (SWE, 2007)** to win back-to-back men's Slaloms at Kitzbuehel.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** claimed his fifth World Cup podium and third Slalom podium of the season in Wengen. It was also the 100th World Cup of his career, drawing him level with **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** in equal third place on the men's all-time list. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the way with 155 podiums. If Kristoffersen gets a podium this weekend he will move into third place outright on his own.
- If **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** finishes in the top 10, he'll move to the 5th place in the all-time men's list with 188 career Alpine World Cup top-10 finishes, level with **Alexis Pinturault (FRA/Head)**. **Kjetil Andre Aamodt (NOR)** leads the field with 233 top-10 finishes.
- **Linus Strasser (GER/Head)** is the only skier to have finished inside the top 5 in the three most recent Kitzbuehel Slalom races. Strasser won the 2023/24 race, finished 4th in 2022/23 and 5th in 2024/25.

- A win for **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)**, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** or **Daniel Yule (SUI/Atomic)** would allow any of them to become the most successful Kitzbuehel Slalom skier among active athletes with three victories.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** needs two more podium finishes to join **Finn Christian Jagge** in the 3rd place for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Norwegian athletes with 17. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads this list with 59 top-3 results.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** and **Timon Haugan (Van Deer)** have five Slalom World Cup victories each. A win by any of them would see them join **Ole Christian Furuseth** in 3rd place for the most Slalom World Cup wins among Norwegian athletes. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads this list with 25 victories.
- If **Manuel Feller (Atomic)** finishes in the top three he will join Tomas Sykora in 5th place on the list for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Austrian athletes with 21. **Marcel Hirscher (Van Deer)**, now representing the Netherlands, is on top of the list with 65 podiums.
- If **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** wins in Kitzbuehel he will join **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** in the 5th place on the all-time for the most men's World Cup Slalom wins with 16. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the field with 40 Slalom victories.
- **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** has finished inside the top 6 of every Slalom World Cup race he managed to finish so far this season. He claimed two wins, one 3rd place and two 6th place finishes while recording two DNFs in Val d'Isere and Wengen.
- **Victor Muffat-Jeandet (FRA/Salomon)** has the opportunity in Kitzbuehel to stretch his streak of World Cup Slalom point-scoring races. The streak that started in last season's Kitzbuehel is currently the longest in the field. The French skier has finished inside the top 10 three times during the streak, with a highest result of 6th place in Kranjska Gora in March 2025.
