

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 –

Men's Giant Slalom Adelboden stat sheet

- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** won the last World Cup Giant Slalom in Adelboden in January 2025, finishing ahead of **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** in 2nd and **Luca De Aliprandini (ITA/Salomon)** in 3rd.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** has won the last four World Cup Giant Slalom races in Adelboden. A feat only matched by **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** between 1978/79 and 1981/82.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** and **Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer)** each have four World Cup Giant Slalom wins in Adelboden. Only **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE, five wins)** has more.
- A podium for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** in Adelboden would be the 46th of his career, seeing him equal **Michael von Gruenigen** and **Vreni Schneider** as the Swiss skiers with the most career Giant Slalom World Cup podiums in history.
- A podium for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** would see him equal **Michael von Gruenigen (SUI)** in 3rd place on the list of the all-time Giant Slalom World Cup men's podiums with 46. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the list with 72 career top-3 finishes, **Marcel Hirshcer (NED/Van Deer)** is 2nd with 59.
- A podium for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** in Adelboden would be the 97th of his career across all Alpine disciplines, putting him on his own in 5th place of all-time career World Cup men's podiums in history. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the list with 155 top-3 finishes.
- **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic)** won the fifth and most recent Giant Slalom race of the current season in Alta Badia ahead of **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** in 2nd and **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** in 3rd.
- Alta Badia was the first time since March 2021 that **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** did not feature on the podium in a Giant Slalom World Cup race in which he finished. He missed a race in Schladming in 2022/23, had three consecutive DNFs in 2024 (World Cup Finals in Saalbach, season-opener in Sölden, and then Beaver Creek) and recorded a DNF in Copper Mountain this season. Odermatt recorded 36 top-3 results during that period, including 26 victories.
- It was a second career victory for **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic)** in World Cup Giant Slalom. He recorded his first World Cup GS victory in 2022/23 in Palisades Tahoe.
- **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** took the lead in the World Cup standings following his podium finish. He now has 305 points, with **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** in 2nd

with 300 points, and **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic)** in 3rd place with 252 points.

- After recording his career-first Super G win in Livigno six days after Alta Badia, **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic)** became only the second athlete after **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** to win more than one World Cup race in the 2025/26 season.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** has five Giant Slalom podiums at Adelboden, but is yet to win a race here.
- In finishing second at Alta Badia, **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** registered his third Giant Slalom podium since he switched allegiances to Brazil in 2024/25. He is yet to claim first ever World Cup GS victory for Brazil. His last victory in the discipline came during the 2022/23 campaign in Alta Badia when he was skiing for Norway.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** has featured inside the top 10 of every Slalom (1st, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish this season.
- **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** has finished inside the top 10 in nine consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup races since Schladming in January 2025. It is the longest active streak in the discipline. He came 6th in Hafjell in March 2025, which is the only time he has been outside the top five during this streak.
- **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** is the only athlete to finish inside the top 10 of each of the five 2025/26 World Cup Giant Slalom races. Furthermore, all five of his results were inside the top 5.
- **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** and **River Radamus (USA/Rossignol)** have each scored points in the last 14 consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup races. No other athlete has a longer active point-scoring streak.
- **Fabian Gratz (GER/Fischer)** finished 5th in Alta Badia, claiming his first career World Cup Giant Slalom top-10 finish. It was the first top-5 result for Germany since the 2022/23 season, when Alexander Schmid (Head) came 5th in Alta Badia.
- **River Radamus' (USA/Rossignol)** 7th-place finish in Alta Badia means he joins **Erik Schlopy** in 5th place on the all-time list of top-10 finishes among US athletes with 13. Ted Ligety leads the list with 71 career top-10 results.
- Adelboden first hosted a Giant Slalom race in the very first World Cup season in 1966/67. A total of 54 Giant Slalom World Cup races have been held there to date - no venue has hosted more Giant Slalom World Cup events.
- Team Austria has the most World Cup Giant Slalom wins in Adelboden with 13. Switzerland has 12 and France has eight.
