

Information to the National Ski Associations for Audi FIS Ski World Cup 2026/2027

FIS Identification Card 2026/2027

Requests for the **FIS Identification Card** (FIS ID) as well as for the local accreditation credentials provided by the Audi FIS Ski World Cup Organisers will be submitted online as in the past.

As per Article 3.8 “Registration & Entries” of the World Cup Rules, teams must use the FIS online systems for FIS ID applications and for team entries. A FIS ID (respectively a FIS Code for athletes) is a pre-requisite for an individual to be included on the team entry.

Detailed information about compulsory accident and third-party liability insurance can be found in ICR Article 212.4. A confirmation letter to FIS about existing insurances is not requested.

Registration open

The application process for the FIS ID card 2026/27 for staff of the National Ski Associations (NSAs) and ski industry will open on the FIS website on June 15th, 2026. The deadline for the NSAs and ski industry to register their staff is August 9th 2026.

Online Entry

Ski Racing Suppliers (SRS), Management and Marketing personnel, also as Racing managers and international service personnel which are not directly related to a national team cannot be entered for World Cup events by a national team. These officials must be entered by their company, using the FIS online entry system mandatory.

Course Access (CA)

For the 2026/27 season, the system will change and there is no longer a season CA. The NSAs and SRS can request the CA according to the following quota on each site by the Organiser, with the official [CA Request form](#) latest 3h before the Team Captains’ Meeting (TCM). The allocated leg bands or stickers will be available at the Race Office after the first TCM. All CA requests are subject to approval by the FIS Chief Race Directors.
