

Facts & Figures Tallinn (EST)

- Tallinn returns to the World Cup for the second time, last time was in the 2023/24 calendar.
- Tallinn is the only World Cup event in the 2024/25 season to feature just one event each for Men and Women, the Sprint Freestyle.
- There have been 11 men's individual sprint World Cup events held in Estonia, 10 in Otepää and one in Tallinn. Klæbo has won the last three, in 2017, 2019, and then in 2024. Making him the only man to have claimed multiple sprint wins in Estonia (3).
- The first and only time a World Cup was held in Tallinn, in 2022/23, Johannes Hoesflot Klæbo and Kristine Stavaas Skistad claimed victories for Norway in the Sprint Freestyle races.
- Jessie Diggins (USA) has already secured her third Crystal Globe as the overall World Cup champion, retaining her title from last season.
- Klæbo holds a near-unassailable lead of 298 points in the men's standings, but can still be caught in the sprint standings with compatriot Erik Valnes just 43 points behind.
- In the women's sprint standings, the consistent Jasmi Joensuu (FIN) leads the way despite only claiming one individual podium this season – and in her career. Olympic and world champion Jonna Sundling (SWE) is 148 points behind.
