

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women's Downhill Crans Montana stat sheet

Previous DH race (Tarvisio) stats

- **Nicol Delago's (ITA/Atomic)** win in **Tarvisio** was the 30-year-old's first World Cup win in any discipline in 134 starts (67 Downhill). **Delago** is the 10th Italian woman to win a World Cup DH race, and her victory marked the first DH podium (any position) for an Italian in **Tarvisio**. **Delago's** younger sister, **Nadia**, finished 10th in **Tarvisio**, which was her seventh top 10 finish in 52 DH starts.
- **Nicol Delago (ITA/Atomic)** had previously made five World Cup podiums (4 Downhill, 1 Super G) without a win, including one other in Italy - her very first podium (2nd in DH). That was in **Val Gardena-Groeden** in 2018/19 on her home course, the Saslong, [where she learned to ski with her father](#). **Delago** is now equal-fifth for DH podiums among Italian women, alongside **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)**.
- **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann's (GER/Rossignol)** 2nd in **Tarvisio** was her eighth World Cup podium, which is equal-10th for German women alongside **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)**, though **Weidle-Winkelmann** is the only skier in that top 10 not to have won a World Cup race. For DH podiums only among German women, **Weidle-Winkelmann** surpassed **Viktoria Rebensburg (GER)** (7) to move into fifth place.
- **Lindsey Vonn's (USA/Head)** 3rd in **Tarvisio** means she is the only skier to have made all five women's DH podiums so far this season. The last time **Vonn** achieved five consecutive podiums within a single discipline was in DH in 2017/18. The last woman before **Vonn** to make five consecutive DH podiums was **Sophia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** in 2022/23.
- **Laura Pirovano's (ITA/Head)** 6th in **Tarvisio** marked eight consecutive Downhill top-10 finishes, continuing her career-best run of form in 43 DH starts. **Pirovano** has finished 4th on four occasions in DH, but is still looking for her first podium in any discipline after 120 World Cup starts.

Crans Montana stats

- **Crans Montana** has hosted 17 women's Downhill races since 1977 when **Brigitte Totschnig (AUT)**, the 1976 Olympic DH silver medallist, won the first ahead of **Evi Mittermaier (FRG)**, whose older sister **Rosi Mittermaier (FRG)** beat **Totschnig** to gold at the 1976 Games in Innsbruck.
- Most recently, **Crans Montana** hosted two women's DH races in 2023/24. The first was won by **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)**, who is one of three Swiss women to have won the DH there, ahead of **Jasmine Flury (SUI/Head)** and **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** who tied for second. The second was won by **Marta Bassino (ITA/Head)** ahead of **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** and **Gut-Behrami**.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has the most Downhill wins in **Crans Montana** with four (2018/19, both races in 2020/21, 2022/23), followed by **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** with three (both races in 2019/20, 2023/24) and **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** with two (2007/08, 2009/10). **Gut-Behrami** is the oldest women's DH winner in **Crans Montana** at age 32 years and 295 days (2023/24), and has the biggest winning margin there – 0.80s ahead of **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** in 2019/20. **Vonn's** win in 2009/10 is the smallest winning margin – 0.01s ahead of **Johanna Schnarf (ITA)**.
- Of the eight women to have won once in **Crans Montana**, three are *active* skiers - **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** and **Priska Ming Nufer (SUI/Kaestle)** won the two races held in 2021/22, while **Marta**

Bassino (ITA/Head) won in 2023/24. For both **Bassino** and **Ming-Nufer**, their win in **Crans Montana** is their first and only DH win to date, while **Ledecka's** win there was her second DH win.

- Eight women have made more than one podium in **Crans Montana** - **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** and **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** share top honours with five each, followed by **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** and **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** on three each. **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)**, **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)**, **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** and **Katrin Gutensohn (AUT)** all have two.
- Other *active* skiers to have made a single women's DH podium in **Crans Montana** include **Breezy Johnson's (USA/Atomic)** 3rd in 2020/21, **Nina Ortlieb's (AUT/Head)** 3rd in 2019/20, **Elena Curtoni's (ITA/Head)** 3rd in 2020/21, and **Laura Gauche's (FRA/Head)** 3rd in 2022/23.
- A win for any skier from **Germany, Norway, Slovenia** or **France** would be a first for that nation in women's Downhill in **Crans Montana**.
- **Switzerland** has 99 women's Downhill wins. A win for a Swiss skier would see **Switzerland** become the second nation - after **Austria** (127) - to win 100 women's DH races. It would also be the first Swiss DH win at any location since **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** won in **Crans Montana** in 2023/24.
- A win for **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** would be her 46th Downhill victory, which would see her tie **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** (46 Slalom wins) in equal-second for most wins in a single discipline, behind leader **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** on 71 Slalom wins. A win for **Vonn** would also extend her record for oldest women's or men's DH winner at any location, including **Crans Montana**.
- Any podium position for **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** would be her sixth consecutive Downhill podium this season. The last time **Vonn** made at least six consecutive DH podiums in *a single season* was in 2010/11 when she made seven. Across multiple seasons, **Vonn** made nine consecutive DH podiums from 2009/10 to 2010/11, which is the longest women's DH streak this century and fourth-longest all-time for women's DH.
- A win for **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** would make her the fourth woman to reach 20 Downhill wins after **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** (45), **Annemarie Moser-Proell (AUT)** (36) and **Renate Goetschl (AUT)** (24).
- If **Nicol Delago (ITA/Atomic)** makes the podium, she will move from equal-fifth on the list of all-time World Cup Downhill podiums for Italian women, alongside **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)**, to outright fifth. A win for **Delago** would make her the sixth Italian woman to win more than one DH race.
- **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** and **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** both have eight World Cup podiums across all disciplines. The next podium for either skier will see them move into equal-eighth for German women (9) alongside **Kathrin Hoelzl** and **Miriam Vogt**.
- If **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** makes the podium she will become the 32nd Austrian woman to reach double figure World Cup podiums (10) across all disciplines. **Puchner** is equal with **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** on nine World Cup podiums, with both vying to become the 144th woman to reach 10. **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** is on eight and could join **Lie** and **Puchner** in **Crans Montana**.
- If **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** makes the podium she will become the fifth Austrian woman (and 15th from any nation) to achieve 20 Downhill podiums. A podium for **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** will make her the 23rd woman to reach 15 DH podiums.

- If **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** wins, she will become the first Norwegian to win more than one women's Downhill race. **Lie** and **Ragnhild Mowinckel (NOR)** are equal on one win each. **Norway** is currently on 89 women's World Cup podiums, needing one more to become the 13th nation to reach 90.
- For Downhill World Cup starts, **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** will make her 130th in **Crans Montana**. **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** and **Laura Gauche (FRA/Head)** will both make their 75th, and **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastart)** her 70th.
- For World Cup starts across all disciplines, **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** will make her 220th in **Crans Montana**, **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** her 170th, **Jacqueline Wiles (USA/Rossignol)** her 140th, **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** her 120th, and **Nadine Fest (AUT/Head)** her 100th.
