

## Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men's Giant Slalom Schladming stat sheet

### Previous GS race (Adelboden) stats

- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** won the most recent World Cup Giant Slalom in Adelboden on 10 January, finishing ahead of **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** in 2nd and **Leo Anguenot (FRA/Rossignol)** in 3rd.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has the lead in the Giant Slalom World Cup after six events with 400 points. **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** is in second with 305 points. **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** is third on 269.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has joined **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** for the most World Cup Giant Slalom wins in Adelboden at five both. Odermatt won all his five races in a row, while Stenmark only had four consecutive wins between 1978/79 and 1981/82.
- The win in Adelboden for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** was the 46th World Cup Giant Slalom top 3 podium of his career, seeing him equal **Michael von Gruenigen** and **Vreni Schneider** as the Swiss skiers with the most career Giant Slalom World Cup podiums in history.
- The podium in Adelboden for **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** was the 20th World Cup podium of his career in any discipline. He recorded 12 podiums (including four wins) in Slalom and eight podiums (including two wins) in Giant Slalom.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** has finished inside the top 10 of every Slalom (1st, 2nd, 4th, 4th, 4th, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (2nd, 2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish during the 2025/26 season coming into the Kitzbuehel weekend.
- **Leo Anguenot (FRA/Rossignol)** claimed his third career Giant Slalom World Cup podium in Adelboden. His previous top 3 finish came in Alta Badia in December 2024, where he was 2nd. No other French athlete had managed to feature on a Giant Slalom since the start of the 2023/24 season.
- **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** didn't finish the 2nd run in Adelboden, which ended his career-longest streak of nine consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup top 10 finishes since Schladming in January 2025. He came 6th in Hafjell in March 2025, which was the only time he had been outside the top five during this streak.
- **Fabian Gratz (GER/Fischer)** recorded his second consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup top 10 finish (5th in Alta Badia, 9th in Adelboden). He had never claimed a top 10 spot in his 38 previous Giant Slalom career starts.

- **River Radamus' (USA/Rossignol)** 7th-place finish in Adelboden means he claims 5th place on the all-time list of top 10 finishes among US athletes with 14. **Ted Ligety** leads the list with 71 career top 10 results.
- Only two nations have managed to claim a Giant Slalom World Cup win this season to date: Switzerland (three wins for **Marco Odermatt (Stoekli)** and one for **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)**) and Austria (one win for **Marco Schwarz (Atomic)** and **Stefan Brennsteiner (Fischer)** each). Only two nations won last season as well: Switzerland (six wins) and Norway (three wins).

### Schladming stats

- A podium for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoekli)** in Schladming would be the 47th of his career, seeing him take the undisputed top spot on the list of the most career Giant Slalom World Cup podiums among Swiss athletes, men or women, in history. Currently he is equal with **Michael von Gruenigen** and **Vreni Schneider** with 46 podiums each.
- A podium for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoekli)** would see him take undisputed 3rd place on the list of the all-time Giant Slalom World Cup men's podiums with 47. Odermatt is now equal with **Michael von Gruenigen (SUI)** with 46. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the list with 72 career top 3 finishes. **Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer)** is 2nd with 59.
- After recording Brazil's maiden World Cup win in Slalom this season, **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** is looking for Brazil's first victory in Giant Slalom. He has recorded four runner-up finishes since he started representing Brazil (Beaver Creek and in Kranjska Gora 2024/25; Alta Badia and Adelboden in 2025/26). Pinheiro Braathen previously won two World Cup Giant Slalom races representing Norway (Sölden, October 2020; Alta Badia, December 2022).
- A top 10 result for **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** in Schladming would be the 84th of his career, putting him in 2nd place of all-time career Giant Slalom World Cup men's top 10 finishes in history alongside **Benjamin Raich (AUT)**. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the list with 101 top 10 finishes.
- A win for **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)** in Schladming would see him join **Joel Gaspoz** in 4th place for the most Giant Slalom World Cup wins among Swiss athletes with six each. **Marco Odermatt (Stoekli)** leads this list with 29 wins.
- **Zan Kranjec (SLO/Rossignol)** and **River Radamus (USA/Rossignol)** are looking to continue their point-scoring streak. Both have scored points in the last 14 consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup races. It's the career-longest streak for Radamus, while Kranjec had a longer streak of 26 point-scoring races during the 2017/18–2020/21 seasons.
- **Alexander Steen Olsen (NOR/Rossignol)** won the most recent 2024/25 World Cup Giant Slalom in Schladming, finishing ahead of **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** in

2nd and **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** in 3rd but he won't be at the start due to injury.

- **Alexis Pinturault (FRA/Head)** will take his 121st Giant Slalom World Cup start, which will put him into equal-fourth place on the list of the most men's Giant Slalom starts in history alongside **Fredrik Nyberg (SWE)**. **Benjamin Raich (AUT)** leads the list with 134 starts. Pinturault is the most successful French athlete, men and women, with the most Giant Slalom wins – 18 - and the most wins across all disciplines – 34.
- Schladming first hosted a Giant Slalom race in December 1978. A total of eight Giant Slalom World Cup races have been held there to date.
- Only one athlete managed to win in Schladming twice: it was **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** in 1978/79 and 1980/81.
- Team Switzerland has the most wins in Schladming – three: **Thomas Burgler** in 1984/85, **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)** in 2022/23 and **Marco Odermatt (Stoeckli)** in 2023/24. Swiss athletes have featured on the podium of three previous Schladming Giant Slalom World Cup races.
- Team Austria recorded two podium sweeps in Schladming: in 1987/88 (**Rudolf Nierlich** 1st, **Hubert Strolz** 2nd, **Helmut Mayer** 3rd) and in 2011/12 (**Marcel Hirscher** 1st, **Hannes Reichelt** 2nd, **Marcel Mathis** 3rd).
- Team Austria hasn't had a Giant Slalom World Cup win at home since **Marcel Hirscher's (Van Deer)** victory in Soelden in 2014/15.
- **Marco Schwarz (Atomic)** brought Team Austria the most recent Giant Slalom World Cup podium on the home slopes coming second in this season's opener in Soelden.
