

FACTS & FIGURES - Women's Slalom in Are

- Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic) entered the weekend tied with Ingemar Stenmark (SWE) for the most World Cup podiums in Alpine skiing with 155, and she can become the outright leader on Saturday or Sunday.
- Shiffrin enters this race with 116 World Cup Slalom starts to her name, including 63 wins (54.3% win rate), 87 podiums (75.0% podium rate) and 102 top-10 finishes (87.9% top-10 rate).
- Shiffrin can win her fourth World Cup Slalom race of the season. She has already won four or more Slaloms in a single season nine times.
- Shiffrin has won six World Cup Slalom races in Are and can win her seventh to make it her outright second-most successful Slalom resort. She has won eight Slaloms in Levi and six in Are and Killington.
- Her first World Cup victory in any discipline came in the Are Slalom on 20 December 2012.
- Because of time missed through injury this season, Shiffrin is only sixth in the Slalom standings, but can still mathematically win the Crystal Globe. With two races to go, she is 163 points behind leader Zrinka Ljutic (CRO/Atomic).
- **Zrinka Ljutic (CRO/Atomic)** has also won three World Cup Slaloms this season and leads the discipline standings.
- In her last five World Cup Slaloms, Ljutic has won three times, finished second once, and recorded a DNQ once.
- Ljutic finished second behind Shiffrin in the last World Cup Slalom race in Sestriere, when Shiffrin won her 100th World Cup race, and Ljutic was also second behind Shiffrin in last year's Are Slalom.
- Ljutic's nine career World Cup podiums in all disciplines entering the weekend have come in nine different countries. Sweden can become the first country in which she has made the podium multiple times.
- Camille Rast (SUI/Head) is the only World Cup Slalom winner this season other than Shiffrin and Ljutic, having won in Killington and Flachau.
- Rast also won the world championships Slalom in Saalbach, meaning that of the nine elite Slalom contests this season, Shiffrin, Ljutic and Rast have won three each.
- Rast's DNF in the last World Cup Slalom in Sestriere broke a streak of seven consecutive top-five Slalom finishes.
- In four World Cup Slalom races in Are, Rast has never finished higher than 12th.
- Rast is second in the Crystal Globe Slalom standings, 39 points behind Ljutic.
- Katharina Liensberger (AUT/Rossignol) has won three World Cup Slalom races in her career, including two in Are (2021 and 2022).
- Liensberger has come fourth in the last three World Cup Slaloms, missing the podium by 0.13s (Flachau), 0.16s (Courchevel) and 0.12s (Sestriere). Between Courchevel and Sestriere, she won bronze in the world championships Slalom.
- Liensberger has finished in the top 10 in her last 11 World Cup Slalom races.

- Lena Dürr (GER/Head) has 15 career World Cup Slalom podiums. If she reaches the podium on Sunday to make it 16, the breakdown will be four podiums in each of the last four seasons.
- In the last five World Cup Slaloms in Are, Dürr has finished fourth (twice), fifth (twice) or sixth (once).
- Those are her only top-10 finishes in World Cup Slalom races in Are. In her seven previous Slaloms in the Swedish resort, her best result was 11th.
- Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head) has finished second three times in World Cup Slalom races this season, behind Rast (twice) and Ljutic.
- Holdener has 38 career World Cup Slalom podiums, but only two victories.
- She has three World Cup Slalom podiums in Are, twice finishing second to Shiffrin and once finishing third behind Liensberger and Shiffrin.
- Anna Swenn Larsson (SWE/Head) or Sara Hector (SWE/Head) can become the first Swedish winner of a women's World Cup Slalom in Are since Maria Pietilae-Holmner (SWE) in December 2014.
- Swenn Larsson has two World Cup Slalom podiums in Are. If she reaches a third podium on Sunday, Are will equal Killington as the venue with her most World Cup Slalom podiums.
- Swenn Larsson can reach her third World Cup Slalom podium of the season to match last season's total. Her career-high is four podiums, set in 2022/23.
- Entering the weekend, Hector had reached three World Cup Giant Slalom podiums in Are, but it hasn't been a happy hunting ground for her in Slalom. In eight starts, her best result is 13th, with four DNQs and one DNF.
- Two of Hector's three World Cup Slalom podiums have come this season.
