

## PREVIEW MEN'S EVENT TRONDHEIM – Sunday 17 Mar 2024

### Jarl Magnus Riiber

- Jarl Magnus Riiber has already secured the overall World Cup of the 2023/24 season. He has equalled Eric Frenzel (5) as the Nordic combined athlete with the most overall World Cup wins.
- No Nordic combined athlete recorded as many wins (16) or podium finishes (19) in a World Cup season as Riiber this season.
- Riiber has finished first (16) or second (3) in 19 of the 20 individual World Cup events this season. He did not start in Lahti earlier this month.
- Riiber won each of the last 12 individual World Cup events in which he started. He missed the World Cup event in Lahti earlier this month.
- Riiber won the last individual World Cup event in each of the last five seasons.
- Riiber won 21 of the 22 individual men's World Cup events on Norwegian snow since the start of the 2018/19 season. The exception was Jens Lurås Oftebro's win in Lillehammer on 3 December 2022 (Riiber finished 2nd).
- Riiber's 100th individual World Cup podium has to wait for next season. He has finished on the podium 98 times.

### Other contenders

- **Johannes Lamparter** (3) is one of three men to win an individual World Cup events this season (Jarl Magnus Riiber 16), Jens Lurås Oftebro 1).
- Lamparter (13) is third on most individual World Cup victories among Austrian men, behind Felix Gottwald (23) and Klaus Sulzenbacher (14).
- **Stefan Rettenegger** is chasing his first individual World Cup win after 10 individual podium finishes (4 second places and 6 third places, all in 2023/24).
- Only four men have recorded as many individual podium finishes in World Cup events without winning as Rettenegger (10): Georg Hettich (11), Ilkka Herola (11), Allar Levandi (11) and **Kristjan Ilves** (10).
- Ilves recorded 10 World Cup podium finishes, including in four of the last six events this season (2-2-4-3-8-3).
- **Jørgen Graabak** has yet to win a World Cup event this season (4 second places and 5 third places).
- Only Akito Watabe (12 in 2015/16) and Graabak (11 in 2019/20) himself recorded more individual World Cup podium finishes without a single win in a season as Rettenegger (10) and Graabak (9) in this campaign.
