

## FACTS & FIGURES – Women's Super G in Kvitfjell

- There have been six women's World Cup Super G races in Kvitfjell so far and current Super G season standings leader Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head) has finished on the podium in half of them.
- She has a win (first race in a 2024 double-header) a 2nd place (second race of that 2024 double-header) and a 3rd place (first race of a 2023 double-header) in her four races in the resort in the past two years.
- Victory in the most recent World Cup Super G in Garmisch, means that Gut-Behrami has four wins, four 2nds, a 3rd and a 5th, 6th and 7th in her past 12 races in the discipline.
- Currently 75 points clear of Federica Brignone in the race for the Super G
  Crystal Globe, Gut-Behrami is aiming for a third successive season crown that would be the first time she has achieved such a feat in any discipline.
- If Gut-Behrami doesn't win either of the two Kvitfjell Downhill races, she will have the opportunity to take 5th place on her own in the list of all-time women's World Cup winners, over-taking Austria's Renate Götschl (46 wins).
- The Swiss star is already in second place on the all-time women's Super G winner's list, with 23 victories. Behind only Lindsey Vonn (USA) who has 28 wins.
- Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol) can win her 12th World Cup Super G race to equal Carole Merle (FRA) in 5th place on the all-time women's list.
- She was victorious in the most recent World Cup Super G in Kvitfjell (the second of last season's double-header) and has a chance to become the first back-to-back champion.
- Currently 2nd in the season standings, Brignone has ended runner-up in the Super G Crystal Globe race four times already, winning the title just once (2021/22).
- Brignone has been on the podium in her past three World Cup Super G races (winner in Cortina and 3rd in Garmisch and St. Anton) a record streak for her.
- She also took silver in the Super G at the 2025 World Championships in Saalbach.
- The 34-year-old Brignone has seven World Cup wins this season already, the most she has achieved in any season in her career.
- Brignone arrived in Kvitfjell with 34 World Cup wins in total, so *depending on what she does in the two Downhill races*, she may have the opportunity to equal or over-take Katja Seizinger (GER) in the all-time women's list (36 wins).
- Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic) has won seven World Cup Super G races and can equal Hilde Gerg (GER) in equal 8th place on the all-time women's list with her eighth victory.
- She is currently sitting 3rd in the season standings her best finish to date is 5th (2017/18 and 2021/22).
- Winner of the Super G in Beaver Creek this season, Goggia has a best Super G finish in Kvitfjell of 4th, in 2023.

- Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head) would appear to offer the best chance of home success. She finished 2nd in the most recent World Cup Super G in Garmisch, has three other top-seven finishes this season and won bronze at the recent Word Championships.
- Her record in Kvitfjell is good too, with a win (Downhill in 2023) and a 4th place (Super G in 2024) in her past four races in the resort.
- Ingeborg Helen Marken (NOR) is the only Norwegian women's Super G winner in Kvitfjell, having won the debut race in 1996.
- Five different women have won the five Super G races so far this season, with **Conny Hütter (AUT/Head)** victorious in St. Moritz.
- Hütter knows what it takes to win in Kvitfjell, having triumphed in the opening Super G race in 2023.
- Aside from her win this season, she has just one other top-five, a 4th place in the opener in Beaver Creek.
- Fresh from winning World Championship Super G gold on home snow, **Stephanie Venier (AUT/Head)** will arrive in Kvitfjell with plenty of confidence.
- She has course form too, having finished 2nd in the Super G in 2023 part of an Austrian 1-2-3.
- So far this season, her best World Cup Super G finish is 2nd in St. Anton her only podium place.
- Lauren Macuga (USA/Rossignol) has enjoyed a breakout season, and much of her success has come in the Super G.
- Her first World Cup podium and first win came in the St. Anton Super G in January and she followed it up with bronze in the Super G at the 2025 World Championships.
- Since coming 5th in the second Super G in Kvitfjell 12 months ago at the time her best ever World Cup result and only third top-10 - the 22-year-old has recorded a further five top-10 results (three in Downhill and two in Super G).
- Fresh from winning Downhill bronze at the 2025 World Championships Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle) returns to Kvitfjell, where she finished 3rd in the Super G 12 months ago.
- Ledecka has just one top-10 Super G finish this season, 7th in St. Moritz.
- Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head) has never raced a World Cup in Kvitfjell.
- She does have a record 28 World Cup Super G victories elsewhere.
- So far the 40-year-old's best result in the Super G in her four World Cup races since her return, is 4th recorded in St. Anton.
