## Men's Super G Copper Mountain stat sheet

- For the third season in a row, Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) begins the new campaign defending the Super G World Cup title.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) became the fifth man to win three or more Super G season titles, joining Kjetil Jansrud (NOR) on three. Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR) and Hermann Maier (AUT) share the men's record with five Super G globes, while Pirmin Zurbriggen (SUI) has four.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) is chasing his fourth consecutive Super G Crystal Globe, which would place him on top of the all-time list alongside Hermann Maier (AUT) (four consecutive titles between 1997/98 and 2000/01) and Pirmin Zurbriggen (SUI) (consecutive between 1986/87 and 1989/90).
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) has finished inside the top 10 in his last 24 World Cup Super G races dating back to the race in Courchevel/Meribel in March 2022, making the podium in 18 of them and winning 11 times during this streak. This is the longest streak in Super G World Cup history.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) needs one podium finish to join Kjetil Jansrud (NOR) on 26 World Cup Super G podiums, which would be equal third on the men's all-time list behind Hermann Maier (AUT, 38) and Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR, 30).
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) claimed his 46th World Cup win in all disciplines earlier this season in Sölden to equal Marc Giradelli (LUX) for the fifth place on the men's all-time list.
- Despite having no wins last season, Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer) finished second in the overall Super G standings, his career-best result. Rogentin scored points in all eight races last season, finishing on the podium twice and finishing in the top 10 six times. The only other two athletes to score points in every 2024/25 Super G race were Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) and Justin Murisier (SUI/Head), who was 17th in the season-long standings.
- Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head) finished third in the season-long Super G classification, despite also not winning any of the races in 2024/25. This was his eighth consecutive season-long podium starting from the 2017/2018 season. Kriechmayr has won one Super G Crystal globe, in 2020/21.
- Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head) has nine World Cup wins in both Super G and Downhill. With an extra win in each discipline, he would become the 11th man to achieve the 'double-double' of double-figure (10+) wins in two disciplines. He would become the fourth man to do the speed double-double after Hermann Maier (AUT; 24



SG, 15 DH), Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR; 17 SG, 14 DH) and Pirmin Zurbriggen (SUI; 10 SG, 10 DH).

- Three racers recorded their first career World cup wins in Super G last season: Mattia
  Casse (ITA/Rossignol) in Gardena, Fredrik Moeller (NOR/Atomic) in Bormio, Franjo
  Von Allmen (SUI/Head) in Wengen and Lukas Feurstein (AUT/Head) in Sun Valley.
- Last season in Kvitfjell, **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** recorded his fifth career World Cup Super G win. No other Italian athlete has more than two Super G victories.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) has now scored at least a point in 42 consecutive Super G World Cup races. He needs another three races with points of any kind to beat the longest-ever streak by Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head, 44).
- Marco Odermatt's (SUI/Stöckli) win in Crans Montana propelled team Switzerland to the undisputed second place in the all-time record list at 52 Super G World Cup victories. Austria leads the field with 87 wins, while Norway is now third with 51.
- This is the first time the men will race a World Cup Super G in Copper Mountain. Only two World Cup men's events were staged here previously: Slalom and Giant Slalom races in 1975/76.
- US skiers have never won a Super G event on home turf. Their best result was achieved in Beaver Creek in 2015/16, when two Americans finished on the podium: **Ted Ligety** came second and **Andrew Weibrecht** third.
- Team USA have been without a Super G win for 33 consecutive races. Ryan Cochran-Siegle (USA/Head) was the last to bring home a victory in the 2020/21 Bormio Super G.
- There were two Super G races in the USA last season. Lukas Feurstein (AUT/Head) was the only athlete to step on the podium in both of them. Feurstein's third-place finish in Beaver Creek was his first career World Cup podium, while in Sun Valley he had his first career win.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) and Hannes Reichelt (AUT) have the most World Cup Super G wins on the US slopes at four each. Reichelt's last win was in Aspen 2016/17, while Odermatt was the winner of last season's Beaver Creek.
- Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (NOR/Atomic) has not yet made a decision on whether or not he will be taking part in this week's race, but if he decides to then he will be competing for the first time since his life-threatening crash in the second race of the 2023/24 Wengen Downhill doubleheader, having now spent 683 days off the circuit. Kilde was defending his second consecutive Downhill Crystal Globe that season.



- Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (NOR/Atomic) is one of the best all-time speed skiers. He
  has 21 World Cup victories (12 DH, nine SG), 44 podiums (20 DH, 24 SG) and five
  Crystal Globes (two DH, two SG and one Overall).
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) recorded his maiden Downhill World Cup win during that same Wengen doubleheader in January 2024. He went on to win his first Downhill Crystal Globe that season.
