

Statistics MEN'S GUNDERSEN LARGE HILL/10KM WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS TRONDHEIM

Jarl Magnus Riiber

- o Defending World Champion in the men's individual large hill/10km event Jarl Magnus Riiber can become the first man to win this event at successive World Championships.
- o Eric Frenzel (2013, 2019) is the only man to have won this event multiple times.
- Riiber was the first Norwegian to win the world title in the individual large hill event. In addition, Norway won this event at two of the last three Olympic Winter Games (2014, 2022).
- At the start of the World Championships in Trondheim, Ronny Ackermann (3 normal hill, 1 large hill), Jason Lamy Chappuis (1 nh, 1 lh), Eric Frenzel (1 nh, 2 lh), Johannes Rydzek (2 nh, 1 lh) and Jarl Magnus Riiber (3 nh, 1 lh) were the men to have won world titles in individual normal hill and large hill events.

Other contenders

- General: Jarl Magnus Riiber (2023) and Johannes Rydzek (2017) are the only men to have won the individual normal hill/10km and large hill/10km events at a single World Championship.
- The other man to have won individual world titles in normal hill and large hill events in the same year was Ronny Ackermann (2005) in the normal hill/15km and sprint large hill/7.5km events.
- o **Johannes Lamparter** won the men's individual large hill event in Oberstdorf (2021) and took bronze Planica (2023).
- The other Austrian man to have won the large hill/10km event was Bernhard Gruber in 2015. He and Lamparter are the only Austrians on multiple medals in individual large hill events.
- o **Joergen Graabak** won gold in the men's individual large hill event at the Olympic Winter Games in 2014 and 2022.
- Jens Luraas Oftebro could claim his first gold medal after winning silver at the men's individual large hill event in Planica (2023) behind Riiber.
- Bill Demong (WCh 2009, OG 2010) and Johannes Rydzek (WCh 2017, OG 2018) are the two men to have won the individual large hill event at the Olympic Winter Games and World Championships.
- Germany (G5-S3-B4, won between 2001 to 2019) has won five of the 13 world titles in all individual large hill events, 2021 and 2023 were the first years in which it did not win any medal in an individual large hill event.
- Japan's Akito Watabe took bronze in the individual large hill event in 2021. Japan has won
 world titles in men's individual normal hill, the team normal hill and the team large hill
 events, but not yet in the men's individual large hill competition.
- o **Jason Lamy Chappuis** (2011) is the only **French** world champion in the individual large hill event. François Braud finished second and third in 2015 and 2017 respectively.
- o **Finland**'s last medal winner in an individual large hill event was Hannu Manninen, who won the sprint large hill/7.5km event in 2007.
