Men's Super G Beaver Creek stat sheet

- Beaver Creek's Birds of Prey course, located in Beaver Creek Resort in Avon, Colorado, first hosted a World Cup Super G race in December 1997. A total of 23 Super G World Cup races have been held here since.
- This will be the second Super G race of the new World Cup season. Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) won the season opener in Copper Mountain on 27 November, ahead of Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head) in 2nd and Raphael Haaser (AUT/Atomic) in 3rd.
- A win for Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) would see him join Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR) in second place on the men's all-time World Cup Super G winners list. Currently, Odermatt has 16 Super G World Cup wins, one behind Svindal and eight behind Hermann Maier (AUT) who leads the field with 24 wins.
- A win would see Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) become the most World Cup Super G skier in Beaver Creek. Currently he is tied with Hannes Reichelt (AUT) with three wins in the resort (2019/20, 2021/22 and 2024/25). Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (NOR/Atomic) has two, no other active athlete has more than one victory here.
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) has finished inside the top two in his five most recent World Cup Super G races in Beaver Creek.
- A podium finish for Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) would see him claim this place on his own in the all-time men's World Cup Super G podiums list. Currently, Odermatt is tied with Kjetil Jansrud (NOR) on 26 World Cup Super G podiums, behind Hermann Maier (AUT, 38) and Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR, 30).
- Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) also has the opportunity to stretch his record streak of men's top-10 World Cup Super G finishes. The Swiss skier has finished inside the top 10 in his last 25 World Cup Super G races dating back to the race in Courchevel Meribel in March 2022. In that time he has claimed 12 wins and 19 podium finishes.
- If Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) scores at least a point in Beaver Creek he will match Vincent Kriechmayr's (AUT/Head) record streak of point scoring in 44 men's Super G World races.
- Marco Odermatt's (SUI/Stöckli) victory in Copper Mountain last month was his fifth World Cup Super G win on US slopes. He also won three times in Beaver Creek and once in Aspen (2022/23). No other athlete in World Cup history has more.
- If Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head) finishes on the podium in Beaver Creek he will join Stephan Eberharter in equal second place on the all-time list of Austrian men's World Cup Super G skiers. Eberharter finished on a Super G World Cup podium 24 times. Hermann Maier heads the list with 38 Super G World Cup podium finishes.



- Raphael Haaser (AUT/Atomic) claimed his 6th career World Cup Super G podium in Copper Mountain. He is yet to find his first win, but has four top-5 finishes (including three podiums) in his past five Super G races.
- Stefan Babinsky (AUT/Head) is chasing a first ever World Cup Super G podium finish. The Austrian finished 4th in Copper Mountain, equalling his best ever World Cup Super G result. He also finished 4th in Super G in Cortina d'Ampezzo and Aspen in the 2022/23 season.
- A top-10 finish in Beaver Creek for Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica) would see him move into 10th place on his own in the all-time list of men's World Cup Super G top-10 finishes. He is already the most successful Italian men's World Cup Super G athlete with 32 World Cup top 10s, 17 podiums and five wins.
- Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head) was 2nd in the Downhill and 4th in the Super G season-long standings in 2024/25. After a win (Wengen) and two 3rd place finishes (Garmisch-Partenkirchen and Sun Valley) last season, he started the new season with a 9th place finish in Copper Mountain.
- Austria is the most successful nation in Beaver Creek Super G history, having claimed 10 wins so far.
- Austria is also the only nation to achieve a podium sweep in a Beaver Creek Super G
 World Cup race. They have done it twice, first in 1997/98 (Hermann Maier/Stephan
 Eberharter/Hans Knauss) and then in 2007/08 (Hannes Reichelt/Mario
 Scheiber/Christoph Gruber).
- Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (NOR/Atomic) has won the past two World Cup Super G races in Beaver Creek he took part in (2021/22 and 2022/23).
- Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (NOR/Atomic) made his return to the World Cup circuit last weekend in Copper Mountain's Super G, 683 days after a serious crash in the second of two Downhill doubleheaders in Wengen. Kilde was 24th in Copper Mountain.
- No USA men's skier has won a Super G World Cup on home snow. The best result was achieved in Beaver Creek in 2015/16, when two USA skiers finished on the podium: Ted Ligety came 2nd and Andrew Weibrecht 3rd.
- Team USA have been without a men's Super G World Cup win for 34 races. Ryan Cochran-Siegle (USA/Head) was the last to bring home a victory in the 2020/21 Bormio Super G.
- The most recent USA podium in a Beaver Creek Super G World Cup race came from Travis Ganong (USA), who finished 3rd in 2021/2022.
