

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women’s Giant Slalom Hafjell stat sheet

Previous GS race (Are) stats

- **Julia Scheib’s (AUT/Rossignol)** win in **Are** secured the Giant Slalom globe and made her the second Austrian woman to win five GS races in a season, after **Annemarie Moser-Proell** in 1974/75. After making her World Cup debut (in GS) in January 2018, **Scheib** took more than seven years (2832 days) to achieve her first win, and just 140 days to reach five.
- **Julia Scheib’s (AUT/Rossignol)** win was her seventh Giant Slalom podium this season, which equals the most GS podiums by an Austrian woman in a single season, achieved first by **Anita Wachter** in 1998/99 and then by **Michaela Dorfmeister** in 1999/00.
- **Paula Moltzan’s (USA/Rossignol)** 2nd in **Are** completed her first back-to-back Giant Slalom podiums following her 2nd in **Spindleruv Mlyn**. It was **Moltzan’s** fifth GS and 10th World Cup podium, making her the 14th **USA** woman to reach 10.
- **Alice Robinson’s (NZL/Salomon)** 3rd in **Are** was her 21st Giant Slalom podium and saw her move to equal-18th alongside **Kathrin Zettel (AUT)** for all-time women’s GS podiums. It also made **New Zealand** the 18th nation to reach 40 World Cup podiums.

Overall Globe Scenarios

- **Mikaela Shiffrin’s (USA/Atomic)** Slalom win in **Hafjell** moved her to 1386 points in the Overall standings, while **Emma Aicher’s (GER/Head)** 3rd took her to 1301 points. The only way **Aicher** can overcome the 85-point difference is if she wins the Giant Slalom and **Shiffrin** finishes 16th or lower. **Aicher’s** 4th in **Are** was her best ever GS result (in 27 starts). If Shiffrin finishes inside the top-15 she will win the Globe and Aicher will finish 2nd, no matter what the German does.
- Two skiers can finish 3rd in the Overall standings - **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** on 1009 points and **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** on 982 points. To overcome the 27-point difference, **Goggia** must finish 9th or higher in the Hafjell GS and needs **Rast** to finish 16th or lower. **Goggia’s** best GS result this season is 8th and her last GS podium (3rd) came in 2017/18. **Rast** has made three GS podiums this season, including one win in **Kranjska Gora**.

Giant Slalom Globe Scenarios

- **Julia Scheib’s (AUT/Rossignol)** win in **Are**, coupled with **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** and **Sara Hector (SWE/Head)** failing to score any points there, guaranteed her the Giant Slalom globe. **Scheib** is the ninth Austrian woman to win a GS globe and first since **Eva-Maria Brem** in 2015/16. Her previous best GS globe rank was 9th in 2024/25.
- In the race for 2nd and 3rd, five women can finish in either position - **Rast** (471 pts), **Hector** (429 pts), **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** (398 pts), **Paula Moltzan (USA/Rossignol)** (392 pts) and **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** (372 pts).
- A top-3 finish for **Rast** will guarantee her 2nd. In order to overtake Rast, **Hector** will need to score 43 points more than Rast, **Shiffrin** 74 points than Rast, **Moltzan** 80 points more than Rast, and **Robinson** 100 points more than Rast.

- **Rast's** previous best Giant Slalom Globe rank is 10th while **Moltzan's** is 7th (both in 2024/25), meaning both are guaranteed a career-best GS globe rank this season.
- Both **Hector** (2021/22) and **Robinson** (2024/25) have previously finished 2nd in a Globe race, while **Shiffrin** won the GS Globe in 2018/19 and 2022/23.

Hafjell stats

- **Hafjell** has previously hosted four women's Giant Slalom races, between 1992/93 and 2005/06. **Katja Seizinger (GER)** is the most notable victor, winning in 1995/96 as she claimed the Overall title but lost the GS globe to race runner-up **Martina Ertl-Renz (GER)**.
- **Julia Scheib (AUT/Rossignol)** has the most Giant Slalom wins this season (5) for a 55% strike rate (SR), ahead of **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** on 2 (22% SR), then **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** and **Sara Hector (SWE/Head)** on 1 each (11% SR). **Scheib** also has the most GS podiums this season with 7 (78% SR), while **Hector**, **Robinson** and **Paula Moltzan (USA/Rossignol)** all have 4 each (44% SR) and **Rast** 3 (33% SR). **Hector** is the oldest GS winner this season (age 33), while **Robinson** is the youngest (age 23 at the time).
- **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** leads for top-6 Giant Slalom finishes this season (8) for an 89% strike rate (SR), ahead of **Rast** and **Scheib** on 7 each (78% SR), then **Hector** on 6 (67% SR). **Shiffrin** also leads for top-10 GS finishes (8) ahead of **Hector**, **Rast** and **Scheib** all on seven each.
- A win for **Julia Scheib (AUT/Rossignol)** will make her the first Austrian (and fourth from any nation) to win 6 women's Giant Slalom races in a season, after **Vreni Schneider (SUI - 6 in 1988/89)**, **Sonja Nef (SUI - 6 in 2000/01)** and **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic - 7 in 2022/23)**, the most among women).
- Any podium for **Julia Scheib (AUT/Rossignol)** will be her 8th Giant Slalom podium this season, which will be the most in GS by an Austrian woman in a single season, and the second-highest for any nation behind **Tina Maze (SLO)** who made 9 GS podiums in 2012/13.
- If **Sara Hector (SWE/Head)** wins, she will move to 9 Giant Slalom career wins. **Anja Paerson (SWE)** has the most women's GS wins for **Sweden** with 11.
- If **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** makes the podium she will equal **Anita Wachter (AUT)** on 45 GS podiums, which is second-highest for women behind **Vreni Schneider (SUI)** on 46.
- **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** will make her 110th Giant Slalom start in **Hafjell**. A win will end her 16-race streak without a GS win, which is her second-longest since her first 22 GS races from 2010/11 to 2014/15. As of 25 Mar 2026, **Shiffrin's** last GS win came 818 days ago in **Lienz** in 2023/24.
- If **Camille Rast (SUI/Head)** wins, she will become the 11th Swiss woman to win more than one GS race. **Rast's** only GS win came this season in **Kranjska Gora**.
- If **Paula Moltzan (USA/Rossignol)** makes the podium in **Hafjell**, she will equal **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** on 6 Giant Slalom podiums, which is equal-seventh among **USA** women. It will also make **Moltzan** the only **USA** woman besides **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** to reach 5 GS podiums in a single season since **Christin Cooper** made 5 in 1983/84.
- If **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** makes the podium she will become the fifth German woman (after **Katja Seizinger**, **Maria Hoefl-Riesch**, **Hilde Gerg** and **Martina Ertl-Renz**) to make a World Cup podium in

Slalom, Downhill, Super G and Giant Slalom.

- If **Thea Louise Stjernesund (NOR/Rossignol)** makes the podium, she will equal **Ragnhild Mowinckel (NOR)** on 5 GS podiums, which is second-highest for Norwegian women after **Andrine Flemmen (10)**.
- **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** will make her 70th Giant Slalom start in **Hafjell**.
