

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men's Slalom

Adelboden stat sheet

- **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** won the most recent Slalom race in Madonna di Campiglio on 7 January. The runner-up was **Eduard Hallberg (FIN/Fischer)**, with **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** finishing in 3rd place.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** has the lead in the Slalom World Cup after five events with 285 points, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** is in second with 282 points, **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** is third on 240.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** is the only athlete who has finished inside the top ten of all five races of the current Slalom World Cup season.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** finished 6th in Madonna di Campiglio, which ended his streak of eight consecutive Slalom World Cup top-5 finishes, Haugan's career longest. It started with his win in Schladming in January 2025.
- **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** claimed his 15th World Cup Slalom win with victory in Madonna di Campiglio, which put him into the undisputed 6th place on the all-time list. If he wins this weekend he will join **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** in the 5th place on that list. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the field with 40 Slalom victories.
- **Clement Noel's (FRA/Dynastar)** 15th Alpine World Cup win put him in joint-third place with **Jean-Noel Augert** on the all-time list of French World Cup wins (across all disciplines). Noel needs three more to join **Jean-Claude Killy** in the 2nd place on that list. **Alexis Pinturault (Head)** has the most victories among French athletes – 34.
- **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** claimed his 32nd World Cup Slalom podium finish in Madonna di Campiglio, putting him tied 10th in the list of podium finishes achieved by all skiers through history along with **Gustavo Thoeni (ITA)**. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the global list with 81 Slalom podiums.
- **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** needs one more World Cup Slalom top-10 finish to join **Alexis Pinturault (Head)** on top of the list of the most top-10 results among French athletes.
- **Eduard Hallberg (FIN/Fischer)** claimed his second podium finish of the 2025/26 season in Madonna di Campiglio. His first career podium was recorded in Levy (FIN) in November 2025, which was the first Finnish World Cup podium since **Kalle Palander's** win in 2007/08 in the Alta Badia Giant Slalom. Hallberg, who was named FIS Longines Rising Star in 2024/25, recorded only three top-15 finishes with a best result of 8th place before the current season. The last Finnish World Cup slalom victory, however, dates back to 2006 in Shigakogen (JPN).

- **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** recorded the second Slalom World Cup podium finish of his career in Madonna di Campiglio. The first one was his first career win in Gurgl earlier this season.
- **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** is having the best season of his career so far, having risen to 3rd in the rankings. He has finished inside the top six of every Slalom World Cup race he has finished this season, recording one DNF (in Val d'Isere). Before the start of this season Rassat had only one top-10 result in 34 Slalom World Cup starts - a 9th place in Wengen in January 2025.
- Two French skiers featured at the Slalom World Cup podium in Madonna di Campiglio, in what was a first since Kitzbuehel in January 2022, when **Johan Clarey** finished in 2nd place ahead of **Blaise Giezendanner (Atomic)** in 3rd.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** has taken part in four Slalom World Cup races at Adelboden, coming 2nd twice and recording two DNFs.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom (1st, 4th, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish this season.
- **Eirik Hystad Solberg (NOR/Fischer)** claimed his first career World Cup top-10 result in any discipline by finishing 5th in Madonna di Campiglio.
- Adelboden first hosted a World Cup Slalom in February 2000. A total of 23 Slalom World Cup races have been held there to date.
- **Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer)** has the most wins in Adelboden Slalom: five. Only one other athlete has more than one Slalom win there – **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer, 2)**.
- **Linus Strasser (GER/Head)** has finished inside of the top six of the previous six Adelboden Slalom races, claiming three consecutive podiums in 2020/21, 2021/22 and 2022/23.
- **Daniel Yule (SUI/Atomic)** was the last Swiss athlete to win at home in Adelboden in January 2020. No Swiss skier has featured on the Slalom podium here since.
- **Daniel Yule's (SUI/Atomic)** 2019/20 win in Adelboden was also the last Swiss Slalom World Cup victory at any Swiss venue. The last Slalom podium finish in Switzerland belongs to **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)**, who was 2nd in Wengen in 2022/23.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** needs two more podiums in any discipline to draw level with **Marc Girardelli (LUX)**, who lies third on the men's all-time list with 100 career World Cup podiums. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the way with 155 podiums.

- Austria has the most wins in the Adelboden World Cup Slaloms: 11. Norway has three victories. Switzerland, France and Italy have two wins each.
- **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** claimed the most recent 2024/25 World Cup Slalom race in Adelboden. **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** was 2nd and **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** finished 3rd.
