

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women’s Downhill Tarvisio stat sheet

Previous DH race (Zauchensee) stats

- **Lindsey Vonn’s (USA/Head)** Downhill win in **Zauchensee** made her the third Alpine skier to reach 70 podiums in a single discipline, after **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** (81 SL, 72 GS) and **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** (96 SL). **Vonn** now has 84 World Cup wins across all disciplines, two behind second-placed **Stenmark** (86), with **Shiffrin** (107) the leader.
- **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** is the only skier to make the podium of all four women’s Downhill races this season. With each victory this season, **Vonn** increases her record as the oldest alpine World Cup winner, oldest discipline winner and oldest winner in that location. **Vonn** has done this twice so far this season - first in DH in **St. Moritz**, and again in the most recent DH in **Zauchensee** aged 41 years and 84 days.
- **Jacqueline Wiles’ (USA/Rossignol)** 3rd in **Zauchensee** meant the **USA** moved from 248 to 250 women’s and men’s DH podiums, becoming the fourth nation to reach 250 after **Austria (919)**, **Switzerland (673)** and **Italy (279)** as of January 14. It was **Wiles’** fourth World Cup podium (all DH) since making her World Cup debut in 2013/14, and sees her move into 10th position on the **USA’s** all-time list for women’s DH podiums, behind **Hilary Lindh (5)**.
- **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie’s (NOR/Head)** 2nd in **Zauchensee** saw **Norway** become the seventh nation to reach 150 women’s and men’s Downhill podiums. It was **Lie’s** ninth World Cup podium (4 DH, 5 SG) and first this season. **Lie** now leads **Norway** for most women’s DH podiums (4), and is fourth across all disciplines (9) among **Norwegian** women behind **Trine Bakke (10)**, **Andrine Flemmen (11)** and **Ragnhild Mowinckel (14)**. **Lie** has one victory among her nine podiums - a DH in **Kvitfjell** in 2022/23.
- **Laura Pirovano’s (ITA/Head)** 4th in **Zauchensee** equalled her best World Cup result, which she has achieved four times now (all in DH). **Pirovano** is still looking for her first podium after 118 World Cup starts (42 DH).
- **Janine Schmitt’s (SUI/Kaestle)** 5th in **Zauchensee** was her best World Cup result, having previously made one top-20 finish (19th) in 11 DH races since making her World Cup debut in 2022/23.
- **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** is the only skier to have taken part in all 59 Downhill races from the start of the 2018/19 season to **Zauchensee**. **Priska Ming-Nugger (SUI/Kaestle)** and **Ilka Stuhlec (SLO/Kaestle)** have both taken part in 58 DH races in that time, followed by **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** on 57.

Tarvisio stats

- **Tarvisio** has hosted three World Cup women’s Downhill races: 2006/07, 2008/09 and 2010/11. The first was won by then-Olympic Giant Slalom champion **Julia Mancuso (USA)**. **Gina Stechert (GER)** won the second by 0.01s ahead of **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** in the only World Cup win of **Stechert’s** career, and the third was won by **Anja Paerson (SWE)**, who by that time had won all six of her Olympic medals.
- **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** finished second in **Tarvisio** in both 2008/09 (at age 24) and 2010/11 (at age 26), while **Lara Gut-Behrami** finished 29th in 2008/09 (at age 17) and 17th in 2010/11 (at age 19). **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)** finished 45th in 2010/11 (at age 20). These are the only *active* skiers to have

taken part in any of the three previous races in **Tarvisio**. **Vonn** and **Curtoni** will take part this weekend, while **Gut-Behrami** is out injured.

- A win for a skier from any nation other than **USA**, **Sweden** or **Germany** will be a first for that nation in Downhill in **Tarvisio**. **Austria** and **Canada** are the only other nations to have made a women's DH podium in **Tarvisio**.
- Any finish higher than 7th by a skier from **Italy** will be a new Italian best in **Tarvisio** for women's Downhill. **Elena Fanchini**'s 7th in 2010/11 is **Italy**'s current best.
- If **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** wins by more than 0.73s, she will claim the biggest Downhill winning margin in **Tarvisio** and become the oldest DH winner in **Tarvisio**. Both marks are currently held by **Anja Paerson (SWE)** with her 0.73s win ahead of **Vonn** in 2010/11 at age 29 years and 314 days.
- If **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** wins it will be her 46th Downhill victory, which will see her equal **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** in second place for most wins in a single discipline (**Stenmark** has 46 Giant Slalom wins). Only **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** has won more, with 70 Slalom wins.
- If **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** makes the podium in **Tarvisio** it will be her fifth consecutive Downhill podium since her victory in **St. Moritz** this season. The last time **Vonn** achieved five consecutive podiums within a single discipline was in DH in 2017/18. The last woman to make five consecutive DH podiums was **Sophia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** in 2022/23.
- A win for **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** will make her the fourth woman to reach 20 Downhill wins after **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** (45), **Annemarie Moser-Proell (AUT)** (36) and **Renate Goetschl (AUT)** (24). A win for **Goggia** will also make her the 26th woman to win 20 World Cup races in any discipline.
- If **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** makes the podium she will become the fifth Austrian woman (and 15th from any nation) to achieve 20 Downhill podiums.
- **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** is on 17 Downhill podiums, which is equal-17th for women alongside **Isabelle Mir (FRA)**. **Suter**'s next podium will see her move into 17th outright, behind **Cornelia Huetter (AUT)** who is on 19 podiums coming into **Tarvisio**.
- A win for **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** will see her move to eight women's Downhill wins, which would be equal-13th overall alongside **Isabelle Mir (FRA)** and **Doris De Agostini (SUI)**. A podium for **Stuhec** will make her the 23rd woman to reach 15 DH podiums.
- **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** and **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** are both on nine World Cup podiums, vying to become the 144th woman to achieve 10. This would see **Lie** move from fourth to equal-third alongside **Trine Bakke (NOR)** for most Norwegian women's podiums, while **Puchner** would become the 32nd Austrian woman to reach double digit World Cup podiums. **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** is on eight World Cup podiums, and could join **Lie** and **Puchner** in **Tarvisio**.
- If **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** wins, she will become the first Norwegian to win more than one women's Downhill race. **Lie** and **Ragnhild Mowinckel (NOR)** are equal on one win each.
- **Switzerland** has 99 women's Downhill wins. A win for a Swiss skier will see **Switzerland** become the second nation, after **Austria** (126), to win 100 women's DH races.
- **Austria** is on 399 women's World Cup wins, needing one to become the first nation to reach 400.

- **Norway** is on 89 women's World Cup podiums, needing one more to become the 13th nation to reach 90.
- **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastar)** will make her 180th World Cup start in **Tarvisio**, while **Nadia Delago (ITA/Atomic)** will make her 100th and **Nina Ortlieb (AUT/Head)** will make her 90th.
