Pre-season planning, new ski developments, what length for what discipline

As part of our season planning, we've focused on organizing and monitoring our athletes as closely as possible, sending our people to New Zealand and Argentina. Naturally, a lot of planning and coordination of staff logistics is required, including

travel arrangements and determining where to be present.

Regarding equipment development, it's an ongoing process in which we're always trying to make adjustments to be faster. We discuss extensively with the athletes to make changes or improvements.

For women:

- SL (slalom): 158 cm
- GS (giant slalom): 188 cm and 191 cm
- SG (super-G): 210 cm
- DH (downhill): 218 cm

For men:

- SL (slalom): 165 cm
- GS (giant slalom): 193 cm and 196 cm
- SG (super-G): 213 cm
- DH (downhill): 218 cm
