



FACTS & FIGURES, Women's Super G, St. Moritz

Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head) has won 5 Super G Crystal Globe titles.

Lara Gut-Behrami has won 5 Super-G discipline titles, tying with Lindsey Vonn (USA) and Katja Seizinger (GER). She has the chance to become the most successful skier in Super-G history if she secures a sixth globe.

Gut-Behrami finished second in the opening Super G of the season in Beaver Creek on 15 December. The 33-year-old won three times last season and came second once and third twice in her nine Super G World Cup races. Only once did she finish outside the top seven.

Gut-Behrami is the reigning Olympic Super G champion and 2021 Super G world champion.

Lara Gut-Behrami has won a total of 3 times in St. Moritz, including 2 victories in Super G.

Lara Gut-Behrami ranks second among the most successful female skiers in Super-G, with 22 World Cup victories

Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic) won the opening Super G of the season in Beaver Creek on 15 December.

Goggia won the Super G in St. Moritz last season and also won here in December 2019.

Goggia was Super G World Champion in 2019.

Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol) came second in the Super G standings last season. It was the fourth time in five seasons that the Italian has finished runner-up, the only season to break this run was when she won the Crystal Globe in 2021-22.

Brignone finished fifth in the opening Super G of the season in Beaver Creek on 15 December.

Brignone won twice last season to take her overall World Cup Super G victory tally to 10.

Those wins helped extend her status as Italy's most successful female World Cup skier. Her career total of 28 wins puts her four clear of Sofia Goggia (ITA).

Federica Brignone can become the oldest skier to win a Super-G World Cup race. The current record is held by Elisabeth Görgl, who won at the age of 33 years, 10 months, and 1 day.

Cornelia Hütter (AUT/Head) finished fourth at the opening Super G of the season in Beaver Creek on 15 December.

Hütter had a win and three second place finishes in Super G last season, on her way to her best ever finish of third in the season rankings.

Hütter was bronze medallist in the 2023 World Championships in Super G.

The last time an Austrian skier won the Super-G in St. Moritz was Michaela Dorfmeister in 2006

Ariane Radler (AUT/Head) was third at the opening Super G of the season in Beaver Creek on 15 December.

It was her second career Audi FIS World Cup podium. She came third in a GS at Altenmarkt-Zauchensee in January 2022.

Stephanie Venier (AUT/Head) was fourth in the Super G rankings last season, securing her first ever World Cup win in the discipline in Crans Montana in early February.

Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle) won the 2023-24 season-end Super G race in Saalbach (AUT) in March. That was the 2018 Olympic Super G champion's second World Cup Super G victory.

Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head) returns to racing in St. Moritz, where she has won 5 times, including 3 in Super-G. She shares the record for the most victories in this location with Mikaela Shiffrin, who also has 5 wins. Vonn is also the most successful Super-G skier in World Cup history, with 28 victories.
