

FACTS & FIGURES – Women's Slalom in Kranjska Gora

- The last three Slalom races at Kranjska Gora have been won by **Petra Vlhova (SVK/Rossignol)**, who is currently out with injury. She won in 2023-24, 2022-23 and 2019-20.
- **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/ Atomic)**, also currently out with injury, is the most recent winner here apart from Vlhova. She won in 2017-18.
- **Camille Rast (SUI/ Head)** currently leads the Slalom standings after four of 11 scheduled races. She also leads the overall Women's Crystal Globe standings.
- Rast has not missed the top five Slalom placings so far this season. She was fifth in Levi third in Gurgl, won the last Slalom in Killington – her debut win – and was fourth in Semmering.
- The last Swiss skier to win the Slalom in Kranjska Gora was Erika Hess in 1983.
- Lena Dürr (GER/ Head) was second in Kranjska Gora last season, behind Vlhova.
- Dürr is currently second in the Slalom standings. Her best finish of the season so far was second in Semmering.
- Dürr was runner up to Shiffrin in the Slalom standings last season.
- Dürr's last Slalom win came at Špindlerův Mlýn in January 2023.
- Anna Swenn Larsson (SWE/ Head) is currently seventh in the Slalom standings. Swenn Larsson has 15 career podiums. She was third in Kranjska Gora in 2021-2022.
- Anna Swenn Larsson and Lena Dürr could become the oldest skiers to win a World Cup slalom. Currently, the record is held by Anna Swenn Larsson, who won in Soldeu at the age of 33 years, 7 months, and 23 days.
- Zrinka Ljutic (CRO/ Atomic), 20, won her debut Audi FIS World Cup title in the Slalom at Semmering on December 29.
- Ljutic became the first Croatian athlete to win a World Cup race since Janica Kostelić in 2006.
- Ljutic was the second straight debut winner on the women's Slalom tour, following Camille Rast's debut win in Killington.
- Ljutic is currently third in the Slalom standings and second in the Overall standings.
- Katharina Liensberger (AUT) is the only woman in the field with more than two career World Cup slalom victories. Liensberger has won three World Cup slaloms, the last coming in March 2022 in Are.
- Liensberger is currently fourth in the standings. She has made two podiums this season –second in Levi and third in Semmering.
- AJ Hurt (USA/ Head) was third in the Slalom in Kranjska Gora last season. Hurt has one other career podium finish, in the GS in Soldeu in February 2024.
- Lara Colturi (ALB/ Blizzard) is seventh in the standings overall, after coming second in Gurgl the first-ever podium in alpine skiing history for Albania.

• **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/ Atomic)**, the defending Slalom Crystal Globe winner, is currently fifth in the standings after winning the first two Slaloms in Levi and Gurgl. She is sidelined with injury.
