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### WELCOME TO TRONDHEIM

### DEAR MEDIA REPRESENTATIVE

A warm welcome to the FIS Nordic World Championships Trondheim 2025. The WSC is the biggest sports event in Norway this decade. Trondheim is proudly welcoming you as host for the second time, the last time in 1997. With its 215.000 inhabitants Trondheim is the third biggest city in Norway. It was founded in 997 by Viking King Olav Tryggvason, now erected on top of a pillar at the city square. This square also being the Medal Plaza, which is a stage two meters higher than the pillar! ### What can YOU do?



### ACCREDITATION

All media representatives on-site in all the venues of the Championships must be accredited with a photo ID card. The accreditation is valid for the Granåsen Venue and Medal Plaza in Trondheim City Center.

There are several checkpoints where access will be controlled, such as the Mixed Zones and the MMC - Main Media Centre. Your accreditation is also your ticket for the Media Shuttle.

The Main Accreditation Centre is located at Erling Skakkes gate 14, situated 300 meters from Medal Plaza in Trondheim City Center. Another Accreditation Centre is located at the Granåsen Venue, situated 100 meters from the MMC - Main Media Centre (Smistadvegen 6).


Accreditations must be picked up in person. Please bring your ID and press card. Lost or stolen accreditation cards must be reported immediately to the Accreditation Centre.

#### **Additional Credentials**

In some areas, supplementary access devices (e.g., armbands, bibs, or additional accreditation cards) might be needed. All TV cameras, microphones, and other wireless equipment must have an accreditation sticker. The Host Broadcaster will hand these out in the IBC – International Broadcasting Center, located inside the MMC – Main Media Center. NKOM – Norwegian Communications Authority - must additionally approve wireless equipment. All these devices are valid only with the accreditation card and must be worn visible.




### **ARENA GRANÅSEN SPORTS VENUE**

Trondheim also hosted the WSC in 1997 at the city's millennial anniversary. The Granåsen Arena is being profoundly upgraded in 2023, in time for the WSC in 2025 – a venue built for everyday use, the future and good enough for a World Championship. Granåsen is Trondheim's main venue for all winter sports related to ski jumping, cross-country skiing, and Nordic combined. Trondheim and its regions have a long and strong sports tradition with great achievements over history. Legendary athletes have made us very proud. The likes of our cross-country skiers Marit Bjørgen, Petter Northug and Johannes Høsflot Klæbo, Nordic combined skier Jørgen Graabak and ski jumper Bjørn Wirkola are some of our heroes. World Champion Bjørn Wirkola had his era in the sixties and has a saying named after him, still in use all over Norway: "To jump after Wirkola", then you really have a challenge. We look forward to seeing the role models for our future from all over the world competing in Granåsen in 2025.

### ARENA MEDAL PLAZA – TRONDHEIM CITY SQUARE

The WSC Trondheim 2025 will present the Opening and Medal Ceremonies at the very city centre. Just at the Trondheim City Square, a 20 minutes' drive from the Granåsen Arena. The City Square is the "home" of Trondheim's founder, Viking King Olav Tryggvason, where he is erected on an 18 meters pillar, just a couple of meters shorter than the Medal Plaza stage. Its surroundings will be the place for up to 25.000 of spectators and others joining the "folk party" including the "VM Fest" with lots of cultural events and food courts placed around the very city centre. The Opening Ceremony 26<sup>th</sup> February at 20:00 at Medal Plaza Trondheim City Square. Medal Ceremonies every night will also start at 20:00 at Medal Plaza. The exception is Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> March where the Medal & Closing Ceremony will be held in Granåsen after the women's 50 km CC. Before every Medal Ceremony there will be live concerts presenting both local and national well-known artist starting from 18:30.

### The "VM-fest"

In addition to Medal Ceremonies & Concerts, our Medal Plaza Fan Zone with Food Market will present typical and delicious Norwegian specialties both for eating and drinking. The entire city centre will be filled with hundreds of public activities attracting thousands of people every night.

### WINNER PRESENTATIONS - SEEDLING CEREMONIES

The winner presentations during the "Seedling Ceremonies" will take place as soon as practical possible after each competition at the Ski Jumping and Cross-Country venues in Granåsen. At the Ski Jumping venue, the podium will be in the centre of the outrun. At the Cross-Country venue, it will be placed in the finish area.

During the seedling ceremony it will be handed out two seedlings, one for the athlete and one to be left behind for the WSC Trondheim 2025. With a sustainable ambition and future-orientated focus, the trees will be planted somewhere in the Trondheim area in the spring. The seedlings are delivered by presenting sponsor <u>Stora Enso</u>.

### IBC – INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING CENTER

The IBC is located inside the MMC. Cleaning, janitorial services and general security will be provided between the official operating times. ### MAIN MEDIA CENTRE

The MMC - Main Media Centre is located at the premises of Granåsen Venue, just by the shuttle bus stop. More than 7.000 square meters will be used for MPC - Main Press Centre, IBC - International Broadcast Centre, TVC - TV-Compound, Press Conference Room, Media Lounge and Media Restaurant. Our Service Desk is located just inside the entrance, and we also offer a photo service by Sony.

### MMC – Opening hours

The MMC will be operational from Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 09:00-16:00. Except from 24<sup>th</sup> February (09:00-16:00), 25<sup>th</sup> February (09:00-19:00) and 3<sup>rd</sup> March (08:00-18:00) the MMC is open every day from 08:00-23:00 until the last day 9<sup>th</sup> March 2025.



### MEDIA TRANSPORTATION


Shuttle buses are provided for accredited media and will depart regularly from Trondheim City Center from 26<sup>th</sup> of February throughout the Championships. From 21<sup>st</sup> of February some media shuttles will be available from the morning. Your accreditation gives you access to the media shuttles. A reduced shuttle schedule will be offered 21<sup>st</sup> February – 25<sup>th</sup> February and 10<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> March.

Bus stop for the media shuttle is located just outside the entrance of the MMC – Main Media Center. The bus stop is for both arrivals and departures. The media shuttle will serve all stops on the departures from Granåsen venue down to the city center. The stop for reaching Medal Plaza at Trondheim City Square will be the Nidaros Cathedral.




