

FIS Alpine World Ski Championships and Olympic Winter Games Rules and Precisions for the Team Combined (TC)

- Is the result of a Downhill (or Super G) run and a single Slalom run held according to the technical regulations for Slalom and those for Downhill or Super G. The Team Combined event consists of two runs.
- Downhill (or Super-G) event of Team Combined must be held on courses specifically homologated for Downhill (or Super-G) respectively. The Slalom may be held on these courses.
- If possible both runs should be held on one day (exceptions can only be decided by the Jury).
- Eligibility
World Ski Championships rules, art. 9.1.3 is valid for the eligibility of the participating athletes, for Downhill (or Super G) and Slalom respectively.
- Participation
A maximum of 4 teams with 2 competitors per team can participate. The Teams are formed by athletes from the same gender and nation. Each competitor is allowed to start only in one event. The competitors that make up the team must be named before the draw of the race. No changes can be done after the draw.
- Draw
Enrollment and starting order draw are the same as those for the individual Downhill (or Super G) race. Teams must be nominated before the Team Captain's Meeting.
- Starting numbers given to the team for the 1st run remain the same for the 2nd run.
- Starting order 2nd run
The starting order for the 2nd run is determined by the result list of the 1st run except for the first 30 places who will start in reverse order. A competitor will not be permitted to start the 2nd run if his teammate was DSQ, DNS, NPS or DNF in the first run.
- The Combined results are calculated by adding both competitors' run times.
- No WCSL and FIS points will be awarded for the Team Combined.
- Prize Money: according to the World Ski Championships rules art. 15.2 (divided by 50% between the two athletes in the team)
- ICR Rules 1211 apply where no specific WSC Rules are defined.

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
