

## Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women’s Super G Crans Montana stat sheet

### Previous SG race Tarvisio stats

- **Emma Aicher’s (GER/Head)** win in **Tarvisio** was her second Super G podium in 25 SG starts. Both were wins and both came in Italy - her first was a victory in **La Thuile** last season at age 21 years and 120 days, which made her the youngest women’s or men’s SG winner since **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** won in **Altenmarkt** in 2010/11 at age 19. **Aicher** is the youngest of the four women’s SG winners in **Tarvisio** at age 22 years and 66 days, beating **Lindsey Vonn’s (USA/Head)** previous mark of 24 years and 127 days from 2008/09.
- **Emma Aicher’s (GER/Head)** 0.27s win ahead of **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** is the biggest winning margin of the three women’s Super G races so far this season, and made **Aicher** the sixth German woman (and 43<sup>rd</sup> from any nation) to win more than one World Cup SG race. **Aicher’s** two SG wins is equal-fifth among German women, alongside **Martina Ertl-Renz**.
- **Lindsey Vonn’s (USA/Head)** 2<sup>nd</sup> in **Tarvisio** was her third Super G podium since her comeback, and her 49<sup>th</sup> SG podium (in 109 SG starts), which is the most for any women’s or men’s SG skier. **Vonn’s** podium ensured the **USA** became the fifth nation to reach 90 women’s SG podiums after **Austria** (237), **Switzerland** (123), **Germany** (102) and **Italy** (98).
- **Ester Ledecka’s (CZE/Kaestle)** 3<sup>rd</sup> in **Tarvisio** was her fourth Super G podium (in 47 SG starts) and her first podium in ten SG races since winning in **Saalbach** in 2023/24. **Ledecka** is **Czechia’s** first and only woman to make an SG podium. **Ledecka** is also **Czechia’s** most successful Alpine skier in terms of World Cup wins across all disciplines (4), which is two more than second-placed **Sarka Strachova**, but **Strachova** has more podiums (17) than **Ledecka** (12).
- **Keely Cashman’s (USA/Head)** 5<sup>th</sup> in **Tarvisio** was her best result in any discipline in 83 World Cup starts (33 Super G), while **Alice Robinson’s (NZL/Salomon)** 36<sup>th</sup> place was her lowest ever valid result in 42 Super G starts.
- **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** and **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** are the only two women’s skiers to have competed in all 44 Super G races from 2020/21 to **Tarvisio** this season.

### Crans Montana stats

- **Crans Montana** has hosted six women’s World Cup Super G races, beginning in 1992 when **Carole Merle (FRA)** won a month after claiming SG silver at the 1992 Winter Olympic Games in Albertville.
- The next five Super G races in **Crans Montana** took place from 2010 onwards, with **Dominique Gisin (SUI)** winning ahead of **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** in 2009/10 at age 24 years and 276 days to become the youngest women’s SG winner there. **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** won in 2016/17, **Tina Weirather (LIE)** won in 2017/18 and **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** won in 2020/21. **Gut-Behrami’s** 0.93s win is the biggest winning margin for women’s SG in **Crans Montana**.
- The most recent women’s Super G in **Crans Montana** was won by **Stephanie Venier (AUT)** in 2023/24 by 0.04s ahead of **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)**, which is the smallest winning margin for women’s SG there. **Brignone** also finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in 2020/21, and along with **Venier** they are the only women’s skiers to have made more than one SG podium in **Crans Montana** (two each). **Venier** is the oldest SG winner in **Crans Montana** at age 30 years and 61 days.

- Active skiers with a single podium in **Crans Montana** also include: **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)** 2<sup>nd</sup> in 2016/17, **Wendy Holdener (SUI/Head)** 3<sup>rd</sup> in 2017/18, and **Marta Bassino (ITA/Head)** 3<sup>rd</sup> in 2023/24.
- A win for any skier from **Germany, Italy, Norway, New Zealand** or **USA** will be a first for women's Super G in **Crans Montana**.
- **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** is the only active women's skier, besides **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** who is out injured, to have won a Super G race in **Crans Montana**. A win for **Stuhec** would make her the first women's skier to win more than one SG race there. As of 31 Jan 2026, **Stuhec's** last SG win came 2600 days ago in **Val Gardena-Groeden** in 2018/19.
- If **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** wins, she will move to nine World Cup Super G wins, which is eighth outright among women. **Goggia** is currently in equal-eighth position alongside **Hilde Gerg (GER)** on eight wins each. If **Goggia** finishes in any position on the podium she will move to 22 SG podiums, which is equal-eighth for women alongside **Anna Veith (AUT)**. **Goggia** is currently in equal-ninth position alongside **Tina Weirather (LIE)** on 21 SG podiums.
- **Italy** is on 98 women's Super G podiums, needing two more to become the fourth nation to reach 100 after **Austria** (237), **Switzerland** (123) and **Germany** (102).
- If **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** finishes in the top three it will be her 50<sup>th</sup> Super G podium, making her the first women's or men's skier to reach 50 SG podiums, and the first woman to achieve 50 World Cup podiums in more than one discipline (DH, SG). Two men's skiers have achieved this previously - **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** (81 SL, 72 GS) and **Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer, formerly AUT)** (65 SL, 59 GS). As of 31 Jan 2026, **Vonn's** last SG win came 2968 days ago in **Val d'Isere** in 2017/18.
- If **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** wins again, she will move from equal-fifth for Super G wins among German women's and men's skiers (2) to equal-fourth alongside **Maria Hoefl-Riesch (3)**.
- **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)**, **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)**, **Nina Ortlieb (AUT/Head)** and **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** all have two SG wins each, vying to become the 31<sup>st</sup> woman to reach three.
- If **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** wins, she will move from equal-13<sup>th</sup> for women's Super G victories with five - alongside **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** - to equal-12<sup>th</sup> alongside **Marina Kiehl (GER)** (6). Any top three finish for **Huetter** would make her the 18<sup>th</sup> woman to reach 15 SG podiums.
- If **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastar)** wins in **Crans Montana**, she will become the fourth French woman and sixth French women's or men's skier to win more than one World Cup Super G race.
- **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastar)**, **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)**, **Marta Bassino (ITA/Head)** and **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** are all on five Super G podiums, vying to become the 44<sup>th</sup> woman to reach six. **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** has four SG podiums and could join them with a top 3 finish. **Bassino's** last podium in any discipline came in SG in **Crans Montana** in 2023/24.
- A win for **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)** would make her the sixth Italian woman to win more than one World Cup Super G race. A top three finish for **Curtoni** would see her move from equal-36<sup>th</sup> for all-time women's SG podiums - alongside **Ragnhild Mowinckel (NOR)** – to equal-31<sup>st</sup> alongside five non-active skiers. **Curtoni's** last SG podium came in **Kvitfjell** in 2022/23.
- **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** will make her 110<sup>th</sup> Super G start in **Crans Montana**, needing just one more to match **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** who leads for all-time women's SG starts on 111.
