Men's Downhill Garmisch-Partenkirchen stat sheet

Headline stats from the Milano Cortina 2026 Olympic Winter Games men's Downhill

- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** won both Olympic speed races in Bormio, becoming the first skier ever to complete the Olympic speed double. Skiers representing the same nation have also never won both speed races at a single Games - meaning von Allmen created history for Switzerland. Both Downhill and Super G have been held at every Olympic Games since Calgary 1988.
- **Franjo von Allmen's (SUI/Head)** victory saw Switzerland join France in equal second place on the list of nations with the most men's Olympic Downhill wins, with five each. Austria leads the list with seven wins.
- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** won his third Milano Cortina Olympic gold in the Team Combined event, partnering **Tanguy Nef (SUI/Atomic)**. Von Allmen joins **Alberto Tomba (ITA)**, **Matthias Mayer (AUT)**, **Jean Claude Killy (FRA)** and **Anton Sailer (AUT)** as men's skiers with three Olympic Gold medals each. Only **Kjetil Andre Aamodt (NOR)** has more – four.
Sailer, Killy and von Allmen are the only male skiers to have claimed three gold medals during one Games. Sailer did so at Cortina d'Ampezzo 1956 and Killy at Grenoble 1968.
- Italy had two athletes on the men's Olympic Downhill podium for the first time in history, with **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** in 2nd place and **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** in 3rd.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)**, who has 24 World Cup wins in speed disciplines (19 DH, 5 SG) earned his first Olympic medal at his fifth Games. He made his Olympic debut in the Super Combined event at the Vancouver 2010 Games.

Previous Downhill race stats – Crans Montana

- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** won the sixth race of the Audi FIS World Cup Downhill season in Crans Montana (SUI) on 1 February. It was his second World Cup Downhill win of the season. **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** finished 2nd and **Ryan Cochran-Siegle (USA/Head)** was 3rd, becoming the most successful USA skier among active athletes in terms of the most top-three World Cup Downhill finishes.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** is leading the 2025/26 World Cup Downhill standings after six events with 510 points. **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** is 2nd with 395, **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** is in 3rd place with 296.
- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** has only twice finished outside the top 10 in a World Cup Downhill since the start of the 2024/25 season. In that time, he has claimed four wins and a total of eight podium finishes in 14 races.

- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** and **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** are the only two athletes who have managed to claim more than one Downhill World Cup win during the 2024/25 and 2025/26 seasons. Odermatt has five, von Allmen four.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has finished inside the top 10 in each of his past 16 World Cup races across all disciplines. He has claimed six wins and a total of 10 podium finishes during that streak.
- **Marco Odermatt's (SUI/Stoeckli)** 4th in Crans Montana was his worst finish of the Downhill season so far. Previously he had three wins (Beaver Creek, the first Val Gardena Downhill and Wengen) and two runners-up spots (second at Val Gardena Downhill and Kitzbuehel). He had finished in the top two for eight consecutive World Cup Downhill races, a run stretching back to the 2024/25 Crans Montana Downhill.
- By failing to finish on the podium in Crans Montana **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** stopped two podium finishes short of **Franz Klammer's (AUT)** all-time longest streak of 10 consecutive Downhill podium finishes, set during the 1975/76 – 1976/77 seasons. The streak of eight podium finishes is still Odermatt's longest and the all-time second longest, level with **Stephan Eberharter's (AUT)** streak set in 2003/04.
- It's been almost three seasons since **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** finished outside the top seven in a World Cup Downhill race – he came 15th in the 2022/23 World Cup Finals in Soldeu.
- **Benjamin Jacques Alliod (ITA/Rossignol)** claimed his first career World Cup Downhill top-10 result by finishing 5th in Crans Montana. His previous best result was 14th place this season in Val Gardena.

Garmisch-Partenkirchen Downhill stats

- Garmisch-Partenkirchen first hosted a World Cup Downhill in February 1970. A total of 39 men's World Cup Downhill races have been held there to date.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** won the most recent World Cup Downhill in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, triumphing ahead of **Beat Feuz (SUI)** in 2nd and **Matthias Mayer (AUT)** in 3rd in 2020/21.
- A win for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** on Saturday would see him join **Hermann Maier (AUT)** in 3rd place on the men's all-time World Cup winners list across all disciplines. Currently, Odermatt has 53 World Cup wins, one behind Maier and 33 behind **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** who leads the men's field with 86 wins.
- A win in Garmisch-Partenkirchen for **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** would see the Italian claim 2nd place on his own in the all-time men's Downhill World Cup winners list. Currently Paris – whose most recent win came in Kvitfjell in March 2025 – sits alongside **Peter Müller (SUI)** with 19 World Cup victories. **Franz Klammer (AUT)** is out

in front with 25 wins.

- If **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** claims a podium finish in Garmisch Partenkirchen he'll occupy 6th place on his own in the all-time men's Downhill World Cup top-3 finishes list, with 35 podiums. Currently he has an equal number of podium finishes with **Franz Heinzer (SUI)**. **Beat Feuz (SUI)** tops this list with 47.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** is chasing a 10th consecutive World Cup Downhill top-10 finish. His current streak, which started in Crans Montana in February 2025, is the second-longest streak of his career; he recorded a streak of 11 top-10 finishes during the 2020/21 – 2021/22 seasons.
- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** has scored points in his past 15 consecutive Downhill World Cup races. This is a career best streak and the second longest current streak among all active athletes. Only **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has more; 24 consecutive points-scoring races. These are career-best streaks for both skiers.
- If **Christof Innerhofer (ITA/Rossignol)** starts in Garmisch-Partenkirchen he'll become the Italian athlete with the most Downhill World Cup starts, men or women, at 156. Currently Innerhofer sits in equal 1st with compatriot **Kristian Ghedina**.
- If **Romed Baumann (GER/Salomon)** starts in Garmisch-Partenkirchen he'll join **Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR)** in 5th place on the list of the most men's World Cup starts, with 387. **Benjamin Raich (AUT)** tops the list with 441 starts.
- If an Austrian athlete fails to win in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, this will be team Austria's 23rd consecutive Downhill World Cup race without a win. This streak would be the all-time longest for Austria, beating the 22-race streak that occurred during the 1985/86 – 1988/89 seasons. **Vincent Kriechmayr (Head)** was the last Austrian to win a Downhill race, triumphing in Soldeu in March 2023.
- If a Swiss athlete steps on to the podium in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, this will be team Switzerland's 21st consecutive Downhill World Cup podium - the longest streak for the team. The longest ever streak of 33 consecutive Downhill World Cup podiums belongs to team Austria (2002/03-2005/06).
- The last German athlete to win a World Cup Downhill race in Garmisch-Partenkirchen was **Thomas Dressen (Rossignol)** in 2019/20. Dressen was also the last German to win a World Cup Downhill anywhere, triumphing in 2019/20 at Saalbach-Hinterglemm. This winless streak now stretches to 51 races.
- With three wins each **Roland Collombin (SUI)** and **Steve Podborsky (CAN)** are the most successful men's Downhill skiers in Garmisch-Partenkirchen.
- Team Austria has the most wins in Garmisch-Partenkirchen World Cup Downhills - 15. Switzerland has 11 and Canada has four.

- **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** has the opportunity to continue to challenge the dominant Swiss speed duo. Franzoni (one World Cup Downhill win and one Super G win) is the only skier other than **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** to record a World Cup win in both speed disciplines this season. Franzoni has one Downhill win compared to three for Odermatt and two for **Franjo von Allmen's (SUI/Head)**. Franzoni started the season having never won a World Cup race.
- Italian athletes have the chance to feature on a World Cup Downhill podium for the sixth consecutive race - this would be their longest streak ever. **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** was 3rd in the first race of the Val Gardena doubleheader and 2nd in Crans Montana; **Florian Schieder (ITA/Atomic)** was 3rd in the second Val Gardena Downhill; and **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** claimed 3rd in Wengen and a win in Kitzbuehel.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has the chance to claim his 10th consecutive top-five finish in a World Cup Downhill race. This streak dates back to the 2024/25 race in Crans Montana in February 2025 and is the longest streak of his career.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** is also going for his 23rd consecutive World Cup Downhill top-10 finish. He is already on the second longest all-time streak. **Beat Feuz (SUI)** holds the longest streak of all, 36.
