

## FACTS & FIGURES - Men's Super G in Kitzbühel

- Two-time defending Super G champion and the current Crystal Globe standings leader Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli) finished 7th in the last Super G, in Wengen. This was the first time he had finished outside the top-five in a World Cup Super G since March 2022.
- In that period, covering 20 races, he has won nine and claimed an additional seven podium spots.
- Odermatt has never won in Kitzbühel. He was second here in the Downhill in December 2024 and December 2022. His best Super G result here was second in January 2021.
- This season Odermatt has a win (Beaver Creek) a 3rd (Val Gardena), and a 5th place finish (Bormio), as well as the 7th place in Wengen.
- Odermatt is currently top of the GS, Downhill and Overall standings, as well as the Super G.
- Fredrik Moeller (NOR/Atomic) is one of the four different winners in the four World Cup Super G races so far this season. He won at Bormio in late December.
- That win marked Moeller's first ever World Cup podium finish in his 27th World Cup race.
- The 24-year-old was 4th in both the first two Super G races this season, having started the campaign with a previous best ever World Cup finish of 21st (which he recorded in December 2023 at Val Gardena).
- Moeller is currently third in the Super G standings.
- Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head) won the most recent Super G in Wengen. It was his debut Audi FIS World Cup win.
- Von Allmen is one of seven first-time winners on the men's tour this season, four of them Swiss.
- The Swiss racer also finished second in the Wengen Downhill. It was his fourth podium
  of the season, after coming second in both the Bormio Downhill and the Val Gardena
  Downhill.
- Von Allmen's best previous result at Kitzbühel is 38th in Downhill last season.
- At the age of 34 Mattia Casse (ITA/Rossignol) is enjoying his best ever Super G
  World Cup season, sitting 4th in the standings.
- Casse recorded a first ever World Cup triumph by winning the Val Gardena Super G in December 2024. It was his 201st World Cup start.
- Casse's best result at Kitzbühel was a fourth place in the Downhill in January 2023. His best Super G finish here was a 5th place finish in January 2020.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** has the most wins at Kitzbühel out of any currently active skier. He has won here four times three times in Downhill and once in the Super G.
- Paris, who made four podiums last season and won the Downhill World Cup in Val Gardena, is yet to finish in the top three at a World Cup race this season.
- **Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer)** has three top-five Super G finishes to his name this season, having ended fifth in Val Gardena, fourth in Bormio and third in Wengen.
- Rogentin's only World Cup win came in the Super G in the 2023/24 World Cup Finals in Saalbach.
- Three skiers at varying stages in their careers have recorded the first World Cup
  podium finishes of their career this season in the Super G. First 23-year-old Lukas
  Feurstein (AUT/Head) finished third in Beaver Creek, then the 33-year-old Jared

**Goldberg (USA/ Rossignol)** was second in Val Gardena. **Alexis Monney** (SUI/**Stöckli)** 25, came third in Bormio.
