

FACTS & FIGURES – Women’s Downhill, Kvitfjell

- There have only been three previous women’s Downhill World Cup races staged at Kvitfjell in Norway – in March 2023, won by Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head), in March 2003, won by Renate Götschl (AUT) and in March 1996, won by Heidi Zurbriggen (SUI).
- **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** won the most recent women’s Downhill World Cup race, at Garmisch in January. She also won the Downhill at St Anton this season. They are the only two Downhill wins of her career. Most of her World Cup wins have come in Giant Slalom (16) and Super G (11).
- She leads the Downhill standings, 29 points clear of compatriot Sofia Goggia, and is chasing her first ever World Cup Downhill Crystal Globe - her best finish to date in 3rd, back in 2019/20.
- Brignone has won seven World Cup races in all disciplines this season, making 2024/25 her most successful season. In 2019/20 she won five World Cup races, and in 2023/24 she won six.
- She currently leads the Overall season-standings by 190 points and is chasing her second ever Big Crystal Globe, having won her only other one in 2019/20.
- Brignone can win her 35th World Cup race in all disciplines. She is currently 10th on the all-time World Cup win list, with 34. She is two wins behind Katja Seizinger (GER) in 9th place.
- Brignone won the World Cup Super G race at Kvitfjell in March 2024.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has won 19 World Cup Downhill races and can become the fourth woman to win 20, joining Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head, 43), Annemarie Moser-Pröll (AUT, 36) and Renate Götschl (AUT, 24).
- In her last 17 World Cup Downhill races dating back to December 2022, Goggia has 15 podiums (seven wins, six seconds and two thirds), one fourth, and two DNFs.
- She was second in the most recent women’s Downhill World Cup, at Garmisch.
- Goggia is currently second in the Downhill standings. She is chasing her fifth Downhill Crystal Globe, and her first since 2022/23.
- Goggia won the Downhill in Cortina in January 2025. She has also won a Super G this season, at Beaver Creek in December.
- Goggia has won 26 World Cup races in all disciplines and can equal Maria Höfl-Riesch (GER) in 15th place on the all-time women's list with 27 victories.
- Goggia was second in the last women’s World Cup Downhill race staged at Kvitfjell, in March 2023, behind Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head).
- **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** won her 46th World Cup race, the Super G at Garmisch in January, equalling Renate Götschl (AUT) in fifth place on the all-time women's list. One more win puts her into 5th place outright. Vreni Schneider (SUI) is in 4th place with 55 wins.
- Gut-Behrami can win her 14th World Cup Downhill race to equal Maria Walliser (SUI) in 7th place on the all-time women's list.
- Garmisch was Gut-Behrami’s first World Cup win of the season. She has won at least one race over the last 12 seasons, apart from in 2018/19.
- Gut-Behrami’s Garmisch win was her 96th World Cup podium, putting her sixth on the all-time women's list.
- Gut-Behrami won the World Cup Super G race at Kvitfjell on 2 March 2024, and finished second in the Super G race the next day, 3 March, behind Brignone. She was third in the Kvitfjell Super G in March 2023. These three results make her the most successful female racer ever in World Cups at this resort.
- **Conny Hütter (AUT/Head)** won the opening Downhill of the season at Beaver Creek and is currently 3rd in the Downhill standings, just 81 points behind Brignone.

- She finished 4th in the World Championships Downhill at Saalbach in January.
- Hütter won the Super G at Kvitfjell in March 2023, and was second here in the Super G in March 2024.
- Hütter can win three World Cup races in all disciplines in one season for the first time.
- **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** won the last women's World Cup Downhill race staged at Kvitfjell, in March 2023.
- Lie is currently 5th in the Downhill standings. Her best result so far this season was 2nd place in Cortina.
- **Ester Ledecka (CZE/ Kaestle)** was 3rd in the Super G in Kvitfjell in March 2024.
- Ledecka got Downhill bronze at the World Championships in Saalbach last month.
- **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** has never raced a World Cup in Kvitfjell.
- So far the 40-year-old's best result in the Downhill in her three World Cup races and one World Championship, since her return, is 6th - recorded in her first race in St. Anton.
- **Breezy Johnson (USA/)** won the most recent senior women's Downhill race, the World Championships in Saalbach. She also won Team Combined gold.
- The 29-year-old has never won a World Cup race. She has been on the podium seven times.
- **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** came third in Garmisch, her first Downhill podium of the season.
- She is defending Olympic Winter Games Downhill champion after winning gold at Beijing 2022. Her last World Cup Downhill win came at Garmisch in January 2022.
